

Dustin Ratliff, Warren County Combined Health District Emergency Preparedness Coordinator, was present for an update on Covid 19.

Mr. Ratliff stated that Warren County has the most vaccinated population in the Miami Valley. He stated that we have plenty of vaccines available and walk-ins are available on certain days.

Mr. Ratliff reviewed the number of hospitalizations, along with the number of ICU beds being utilized with Covid patients and stated that staffing levels are no longer an issue.

There was discussion relative to age and obesity as it relates to Covid deaths as well as the mask mandate.

There was discussion on the ability of Warren County to remove the mask mandate on our premises but make N95 masks available at the front desk for anyone who desires to utilize one.

Commissioner Jones stated she would oppose anything that goes against the Ohio Health Department orders.

Dr. Glenn Hoffmann, Warren County resident and former infertility specialist, discussed obesity being the leading cause of infertility and the importance of taking Vitamin D as it relates to lowering your BMI.

Dr. Hoffmann questioned the status of the draft resolution the Board was considering as it relates to  $2^{nd}$  Amendment support. He stated his understanding that the resolution was just a statement but felt the need for his elected representatives to make the statement is important.

Commissioner Young stated that he does not normally get involved in political agendas because it is not in the county commissioner "wheelhouse" but stated his desire to support this cause but will leave it up to his fellow county commissioners.

Commissioner Jones stated her requested amendments to the resolution of support have been addressed and she is prepared to move forward.

Commissioner Young then read aloud the draft resolution and upon discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #21-0539) to affirm the Board of Commissioners support of the Constitutions of the United States and the State of Ohio, The Bill of Rights, and all other amendments thereto.

On motion of Commissioner Jones, being seconded by Commissioners Grossmann, with a Unanimous voice vote, at 11:00 a.m. the Board adjourned into Executive Session under ORC 121.22 (G)(8) to discuss confidential information including specific business strategies of CORE FIVE directly related to a request for economic development assistance in the form of a CRA application for 296 acres in the Turtlecreek CRA under ORC 3735.671 seeking an abatement and exited at 12:32 p.m.

Upon motion the meeting was adjourned.




## The Challenge


- No significant change in youth attitudes and behaviors around drinking in the past 10 years
- Youth behavior tied to perception of approval of others, friends and parents
- Lots of efforts and focus educating youth and their peers, but little to no effort towards impacting adult role models

# **Adult Role Modeling**

- How adults drink is important, and modeling low risk drinking is the message youth need to see.
- High Risk Alcohol Consumption perceived as normal in our culture; restaurants, festivals, cookouts, etc.
- Adults Binge drinking sends a clear message to youth- "We approve of this behavior"



#### **Data Points**

 71% increase in Binge Drinking amongst young women since 2010

The average Ohio "Binge Drinker" ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in the amount of Alcohol consumed (CDC January 2020), aligning with growing concerns we see amongst both men & women

- 2015-19 in OH
  - 7% increase in Alcohol taxes.
  - 0.6% increase in Population






# A habit that requires means...

The estimated percentage of Ohio binge drinking (among adults who consumed alcohol) during past month among those ages 19 and older, by income.




# Adult Binge Drinking in our Community






### Cycle of Misconceptions & Behaviors



# US Route 22-3 Fosters Viaduct Deck Rehabilitation Project by ODOT







- Second part of a two bridge rehabilitation that includes the SR 48 bridge over the Litlle Miami River done last year
- Scheduled closure is for 50 days beginning June 7<sup>th</sup>
- ODOT will be placing signs and message boards to detour traffic to northbound Columbia Road, westbound Western Row Road to northbound I-71 to southbound State Route 48



- Traffic volumes currently
  - US Route 22 carries 16,000 vehicles per day
  - Old 3'C Highway over the Little Miami River carries about 13,000 vehicles per day
  - Socialville-Fosters Road carries about 7,000 vehicles per day
  - Fosters-Maineville Road carries about 9,000 vehicles per day



- We anticipate a heavy volume as this is the most direct route from I-71 corridor to the western half of Hamilton Township
- Old 3'C Highway will carry the major load of this detour



- Therefore it is recommended to reduce left turning traffic as much as possible by eliminating the following left turns
  - Eastbound Socialville-Fosters to Old 3'C Highway
  - Westbound Fosters-Maineville to Old 3'C Highway
  - Eastbound Old 3'C Highway to Socialville-Fosters
  - Westbound Old 3'C Highway to Fosters-Maineville
  - Westbound Old 3'C Highway to Davis Road
- Close the Little Miami Trail across Old 3'C Highway

We are working with the Parks and Recreation Division of ODNR for permission to post trail closures at this location
