Among the award recipients was our esteemed Warren County Common Pleas Judge Robert Peeler of whom we are very proud for his tireless efforts in the fight against our own county's heroin epidemic. The Heroes Against Heroin humanitarian awards program is led by Transitions, Inc., the largest substance abuse disorder treatment center in Northern Kentucky. The program and benefit for the nonprofit organization started in 2015.




FAMILY FUN DAY FESTIVAL HELD BY THE WARREN COUNTY BOARD OF DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

The Warren County Board of Developmental Disabilities (WCBDD) held their 7th Annual Family Fun Day festival in Springboro on Saturday, September 17, 2016 at The Miracle League Field at the Springboro Junior High School.

This event was free and open to the community. Each year, it is held for families who have children with disabilities, but is also open to everybody of all abilities. There were inflatable bounce houses, face painting, games, arts and crafts, horse drawn carriage rides, a small animal petting zoo, and food and beverages. Most of the rides, games, and attractions were accessible to those in wheelchairs or walkers. Everything at the event was staffed and run by employees of WCBDD.

The Warren County Board of Developmental Disabilities supports more than 1,800 individuals with disabilities, and their families, through Early Intervention, Adult, Employment, Residential, Therapy, and other programs.



1916 INFIRMARY TIME CAPSULE 100 YEARS






On October 4, 2016,

FOSTER PARENTS NEEDED IN WARREN COUNTY

The Warren County Children Services is always in need of individuals who are willing to open their homes to children who are in the temporary custody of our agency.

Foster parents play an important role in helping children, youth, and families achieve stability. Once a child or sibling group is placed in a home, a new journey begins that can last anywhere from overnight to several months. After the immediate safety of the child has been addressed, the next priority is reuniting the child with their birth family. By working in partnership with a child's family and a team of professionals, foster parents can help the child return home or move toward another permanent option. Slightly more than half of all children who go into foster care return to their birth families. Establishing a positive relationship with a child's family also can enhance a child's general well-being. When children see their foster parents cooperating with their families, they can feel more relaxed and can focus on the important developmental tasks of childhood.

The Warren County Records Center and Archives will be hosting the Fall Warren County Community Shred Day at the Warren County Administration Building Saturday, October 8th from 10:00am to 1:00pm.

Partnering with Royal Document Destruction, this event will be FREE and open to the any Warren County resident. There is a maximum of 5 boxes per trip through the line. Assistance will be available for unloading boxes. Items in bags will not be accepted. No need to remove: paper clips, staples, binder clips, file folders, report ledgers, magazines, rubber bands. Items that cannot be shredded: plastics (cds, floppy disks, 3-ring binders), glass, electronics, metals, cardboard, audio/video tapes, and x-rays. This event will be in the parking lot of the Warren County Administration Building.




