Multi-Vehicle Accident

On February 23rd at 16:25, Lebanon and Warren Co Communications Center took six different 911 calls for the same multi-vehicle crash on State Route 48 at Kingsview Dr. An off duty Hamilton County unit was on scene initially and the WCSO District 9 deputy arrived shortly there after to assist Lebanon PD and OSP. Due to multiple injured parties, Lebanon ended up requesting 4 additional mutual aid medics from Warren County (image of CAD recommended units below). With the new CAD, we were able to see at a glance the closest medic units available and roughly how far they were to the scene. This turns out to be a valuable tool each day, since it takes into account not only which units are unavailable or assigned to other calls, but also if a unit is not in station. The AVL location is used to recommend it, not just the station to which it is assigned. This is particularly helpful for out of county mutual aid, like when West Chester calls for a Mason medic, Franklin calls for a JEMS medic, etc. The closest resource to the emergency is sent.

EMA Spotlight

Proposed 50-Day Closure of the Fosters Viaduct (US 22/3 bridge) over the Little Miami River



The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) plans to close the Fosters Viaduct (US 22/3 bridge) over the Little Miami River for 50 calendar days beginning June 7, 2021. Please note that there may be lengthy traffic delays in the area for the duration of the project during the typical high traffic volume periods.

Other closures/lane restrictions expected for the duration of the project in order to improve capacity and safety along Old 3C while the US 22/3 bridge is closed:

- The eastbound lane of Socialville-Fosters Road and the westbound lane of Fosters-Maineville Road will both be closed on their approach to Old 3C.
- Left turns from Old 3C onto Socialville-Fosters Road, Fosters-Maineville Road, and Davis Rd. will be prohibited.
- The Little Miami Scenic Park Trail crossing at Old 3C will be closed.
