DISCUSSIONS

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board accepted and approved the consent agenda.

Carol Mann, Daughters of the American Revolution Vice Regent, was present for the Board to proclaim September 17 – September 23, 2015 as "Constitution Week" in Warren County.

Paul Kindell, Telecommunications Director, was present for a work session to discuss Request for Proposals for the Next Generation 911 System for Warren County.

Mr. Kindell stated that the Board accepted nine proposals and a review committee was established consisting of himself, Michael Bunner (Warren County Emergency Services), Todd Tolliver (Lebanon Dispatch), Chief Whitman (Franklin Police) and Melissa Bour (Warren County Emergency Services). He stated that the review committee evaluated and ranked the proposals and then proceeded to hold demonstrations from the top three ranking vendors.

Mr. Kindell stated that the review committee has recommended Indigital Telecom as the top proposal and vendor.

Mr. Kindell then reviewed how the system works and the backup plan in the event of a line break/system failure and stated that after the new system is implemented, they will be able to received text messages into the 911 center. He stated that our current system is aging out and we are now having problems finding spare parts.

There was discussion relative to the cost of the system.

Tiffany Zindel, Deputy County Administrator, stated that the Board budgeted \$600,000 towards this project last year and \$2 million towards the new CAD system.

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Mr. Kindell reviewed the proposed costs as follows:

Warren County	\$623,322.48
City of Lebanon	\$ 93,008.14
City of Franklin	\$ 93,008.14

Commissioner Young stated that the City of Franklin and the City of Lebanon are choosing to each spend \$93,000 in order to maintain their own 911 dispatching services, which the county is willing to provide at no cost.

Dave Gully, County Administrator, stated that the cities desire to provide a 24 hour, 7 day a week direct contact for their residents and they have determined the cost is worth it.

Mr. Kindell stated that the City of Lebanon and City of Franklin have agreed to the cost and he is awaiting receipt of a Memorandum of Understanding relative to the costs.

Commissioner Young stated he is pleased with the number of responses to the Request for Proposal given the lack of vendors in the past.

Upon further discussion, the Board stated their concurrence with the review committee's recommendation to choose Indigital Telecom.

Sheriff Sims was present along with numerous representatives from law enforcement to thank the Board for their unsolicited comments last week indicating support for Warren County Law Enforcement.

Sheriff Sims stated that with all of the tragic killings across the nation of police officers, he is requesting the Board to officially adopt a resolution in support of law enforcement and allow him to publicize the support.

Commissioner South stated her appreciation for what law enforcement does for the community and with deep respect; it is a privilege to adopt the resolution.

Commissioner Grossmann stated he wholeheartedly agrees with the resolution and offers his full support.

Commissioner Young stated his appreciation for the critical piece of public service law enforcement provides to society to protect us. He stated it is very troublesome that the police are no longer given the benefit of the doubt from society and he stated his 100% support for the resolution.

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Upon further discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #15-1429) to support Warren County Law Enforcement and Officers Nationwide.

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board entered into executive session at 10:06 a.m. to discuss personnel matters relative to hiring and/or specific compensation within Children Services, Facilities Management, Water and Sewer, and Economic Development pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22 (G)(1) and exited at 11:00 a.m.

Upon motion the meeting was adjourned.
