The applicant must be able to pass a criminal background check and drug test. After hiring, the officer must become certified to perform ORAS and obtain certification for use of a firearm. A valid driver's license is mandatory.

## Listed below is a summary of the JOB DUTIES:

The officer will be responsible for the hook-up and monitoring of various electronic devices. The position entails supervision of a diverse offender caseload, preparation of reports for the court regarding defendant's progress and adjustment, and maintenance of case files and evaluations. Motivational interviewing and use of risk assessment tools is required to identify and address needs and supervision requirements. The officer will make contact with probationers, families, referral partners, etc., in the office or field as required. Other duties may include substance abuse screening, court appearances, and report writing. Events will be documented, written reports completed, and cases staffed with judges as events occur.
