Commissioner Shannon Jones convened business leaders, educators and workforce partners to collaborate around the challenges of attracting and retaining a strong workforce.

The Commissioners continued the process of advancing the strategic plan for the county's facilities.

Thank you for your continued interest and partnership with the Board of Commissioners to make Warren County the best place to live, work, and visit!


2024 ANNUAL BUDGET

MAINTAINING THE COUNTY'S STRONG FINANCIAL POSITION

The Board of Commissioners adopted the annual 2024 general fund budget during their final meeting of 2023, totaling \$89,924,000, with anticipated revenues for 2024 coming in at \$93,692,000. Sales tax continues to be strong for the county, with receipts just under \$55 million for 2023. As a reflection of their steadfast approach to conservative fiscal management, the Board is proud to report that the general fund continues to have zero debt payments in 2024.

Over the past five years, the Board has remained committed to creating an infrastructure bank that now totals \$47 million. This fund allows the county to have resources readily available for needed projects. This comes in addition to their \$12 million rainy day fund and \$50 million carry-over.

CYBER DEFENSE

STRENGTHENING CYBERSECURITY

Public safety is the number one priority of local government, and the need for an aggressive cyber risk mitigation plan has only increased as county services rely more and more on technology. The Commissioners have been consistent in their desire to make needed investments in cybersecurity so that all of the county's assets are protected. Through a multifaceted approach, Warren County Telecommunications and IT Department is working hard to ensure that leaders county-wide are developing trusted networks and not getting beat by the basics.

TOURISM BY THE NUMBERS

WARREN COUNTY IS THE BEST PLACE TO LIVE, WORK, AND VISIT!

Accounting for nearly \$1.5 billion in annual economic impact, tourism continues to be Warren County's #1 industry. 2023 reporting showed roughly 13.4 million visitors to the county. Employment opportunities in hospitality, food service, and the county's many tourist attractions support more than 12,000 jobs and \$346 million in wages. An estimated \$809 million annual economic impact is generated for the region from sports tourism. Seeing the great economic opportunity in youth sports and beyond, Warren County continues to grow this business, and in 2023 was named the #2 sports destination in the nation by the sports tourism index!







CINCINNATI OPEN IS AT HOME IN WARREN COUNTY

WE ARE PLEASED TO ANNOUNCE THE CINCINNATI OPEN IS STAYING IN WARREN COUNTY!



Commissioner Dave Young spearheaded the discussions on behalf of the Board of Commissioners and led the effort as the State, County, City of Mason and Convention & Visitor's Bureau worked together to ensure the Cincinnati Open (FKA: Western & Southern Open) remained in Warren County. The tournament is a key asset to the region, drawing an impressive amount of international attention, and we are proud to have it continue to call Warren County home for the next 25 years. Beemok Capital, the new

tournament owner, plans to invest approximately \$130 million into the current facility, and the State, County and City worked to provide local match dollars. Looking forward to the 2024 tournament, and the expansion plans that are underway!





COMMISSIONER JONES' NACo LEADERSHIP

COUNTIES COMING TOGETHER TO ADVANCE LOCAL PRIORITIES

Commissioner Shannon Jones currently serves as the chair for the National Association of County's (NACo) Human Services and Education (HSE) Policy Steering Committee. In this appointed role, Commissioner Jones is actively involved in shaping policy priorities for services that counties provide to children, families, senior citizens, veterans, individuals with disabilities, and more. The platform and policies determined by the committee inform the advocacy efforts for counties across the country at the federal level.

In addition to this, Commissioner Jones was

elected to one of two Ohio seats on the NACo Board of Directors. Similar to her role in the policy steering committee, this seat allows her to participate in the governance of the policies and priorities for the whole association. These positions allow Commissioner Jones to not only be directly involved in representing what matters most to counties at a national level, but also gain insights and share her own with commissioners from all over the United States.

ONEOHIO RECOVERY FOUNDATION

1ST ROUND OF GRANT FUNDING NOW OPEN

Leaders from around the state have been hard at work standing up a structure to begin distributing funds from the OneOhio opioid settlement. The first round of the grant submission process is now open until May 3rd. Projects that prevent, treat and support recovery services and meet the eligibility requirements can be submitted through the OneOhio Recovery Foundation's portal. After projects are reviewed by the Foundation, each

region will have the opportunity to vote on the projects they would like to have approved for funding. Warren County sits in Region 14 and has been busy collaborating with its neighboring county partners to ensure that the funds go to projects that will have the strongest impact in the region.



UPDATE ON THE ALTAFIBER BROADBAND BUILD

Work continues on the plan to get 100% of the county access to reliable broadband services. The Commissioners signed a contract with altafiber in March of 2023, leveraging just under \$5 million in American Rescue Plan Act funds, to unlock a \$100 million private investment. altafiber spent much of 2023 strengthening and extending pre-existing connections, as plans are underway to prioritize the eastern portions of the county that are unserved or underserved.

8,865 locations have been fiber qualified since contract start date.

More than 52,000 locations will have access to fiber once project is complete!

Determining a real and present emergency exists based on evidence in the record that 12 watermain breaks to-date have caused actual physical disaster to structures along State Route 48 in Maineville and other residences and business structures in the same vicinity may imminently sustain actual physical disaster thereby necessitating this Board to approve the State Route 48 – Maineville Watermain Replacement Project without further delay and proceed with hiring a contractor without competitive bidding

DETERMINING A REAL AND PRESENT EMERGENCY EXISTS BASED ON EVIDENCE IN THE RECORD THAT 12 WATERMAIN BREAKS TO-DATE HAVE CAUSED ACUTAL PHYSICAL DISASTER TO STRUCTURES ALONG STATE ROUTE 48 IN MAINEVILLE AND OTHER RESIDENCES AND BUSINESS STRUCTURES IN THE SAME VICINITY MAY IMMINENTLY SUSTAIN ACTUAL PHYSICAL DISASTER THEREBY NECESSITATING THIS BOARD TO APPROVE THE STATE ROUTE 48 – MAINEVILLE WATERMAIN REPLACEMENT PROJECT WITHOUT FURTHER DELAY AND PROCEED WITH HIRING A CONTRACTOR WITHOUT COMPETIVE BIDDING

WHEREAS, in accordance with Ohio Revised Code 307.86, competitive bidding requirements and certain exceptions, including: competitive bidding is not required when a Board of County Commissioners makes a determination that a real and present emergency exists, and that determination and the reasons for it are entered into the minutes of the proceedings of the Board, when, inter alia, there is actual physical disaster to structures; and

WHEREAS, Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer, presented evidence during the February 27, 2024 regular meeting of this Board relative to a chronic problem area along State Route 48 in Maineville wherein 12 water main breaks in close proximity suddenly and unexpectedly occurred in a short time span and caused actual physical disaster to residences and businesses in that vicinity; and

WHEREAS, to date, the Board has received and paid out a claim to one of the property owners who suffered damage with partial loss and destruction of his residential structure; and

WHEREAS, during the February 27, 2024 regular meeting of this Board, Mr. Brausch opined the causation of the water main breaks is the 1960's cast iron pipe breaking, especially during dry weather conditions, and such circumstances create a real and present emergency that such breakages will continue to occur imminently and cause detrimental impact to other residences and businesses necessitating immediate preventative action; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Brausch further advised the Board that 1,000 feet of water line must be replaced, and that the Water and Sewer Department intended to use its own workforce to expedite the completion of the design phase of the 1,000 feet of water line due to the urgency of this matter; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Brausch has completed the design phase and produced the attached plans for the State Route 48 – Maineville Watermain Replacement Project; and

WHEREAS, the cost estimate for the said Project is \$714,500; and

WHEREAS, the Water and Sewer Department requests the Board approve the State Route 48 – Maineville Watermain Replacement Project and further authorize the project to proceed by hiring a contractor without competitive bidding due to the existence of a real and present emergency.






