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DISCUSSIONS	
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On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board accepted and approved the consent agenda.

There was discussion relative to a water leak at Turtlecreek Township's park on Greentree Road.

The Turtlecreek Township Trustees have requested that the water bill of \$598.23 be waived in an amount that they only pay the regular usage cost of \$20.70.

There was discussion relative to the taxpayer's dollars being used to pay the excess water bill and upon discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #13-0196) to require the Township to pay the actual cost of the water to Warren County which was determined to be \$91.90.

Martin Russell, Economic Development Director, was present along with Jason Millard, City of Lebanon Economic Development Director, to present) legislation to approve the Joint Economic Development District (JEDD) between the City of Lebanon and Turtlecreek Township Trustees for property located along the intersection of SR 123 and I-71 in Turtlecreek Township.

Mr. Russell explained what a JEDD is and why it is formed.

Commissioner Young stated when a city and township cooperate for the greater good of business; it is always a good thing.

Commissioner South commended Turtlecreek Township and the City of Lebanon for their cooperation in this matter.

Commissioner Ariss stated that this JEDD will be a good thing for everyone concerned.

Upon further discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #13-0197) to approve the creation of the Lebanon-Turtlecreek Joint Economic Development District.

Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer, Warren County Water and sewer Department will review bid for a recommendation at a later date.

Mike Bunner, Director of Emergency Services, was present along with Jim Bolen, LEPC Coordinator, to discuss the need to re-establish the Emergency Management Executive Committee.

Mr. Bunner gave a brief history of the Executive Committee and stated that there are some "loose ends" that need to be amended in the agreement between the Executive Committee and Warren County relative to the ability to amend the local share amount charged to the communities. He also stated his opinion that a yearly meeting of the Executive Committee be required in order for the local jurisdictions to understand that they are a partner in Emergency Management and it is not the sole responsibility of county government.

Upon discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #13-0198) to reconvene the Warren County Emergency Management Executive Committee (WCEMEC) to reaffirm the Agreement entered into by Warren County Emergency Management Executive Committee and Warren County Board of Commissioners on behalf of the Warren County Department of Emergency Services signed February 2, 1999.

Upon further discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #13-0199) to appoint Tom Ariss as the Commissioner appointment to the Warren County Executive Committee for an indefinite term.

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board entered into executive session at 9:45 a.m. to discuss personnel relative to specific employees within Emergency Management and Facilities Management pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22 (G)(1) and exited at 10:21 a.m.

Sheriff Sims was present along with the local police chiefs, the Warren County Prosecutor and representatives from the Warren County Common Pleas Court for a work session to discuss the Warren County Jail overcrowding problem.

Sheriff Sims presented the attached PowerPoint presentation showing the population of the jail through January 2013 to date and stated that in 2012, the jail was above capacity 132 times.

Sheriff Sims informed the Board that he has contacted Butler County regarding available bed space and was informed that Warren County would be required to rent space to accommodate 50 inmates due to their requirement to open a new wing to accommodate our request. He stated that he would only need 10-20 beds, not 50.

David Fornshell, Warren County Prosecutor, stated that he has seen a 12% increase in felony charges filed in 2012. He also stated the increase in the number of felony convictions being sentences to the county jail rather than state prison.

There was discussion relative to the increase in the number of participants in the Community Control program rather than being housed in the jail.

Sheriff Sims stated that in 2008 there were 439 clients on ankle bracelets and in 2012, they had 999 clients.

Mike Steele, Community Corrections, stated the increase in post-conviction violations and child support. He also stated the increase in drug use, heroin in particular being a majority of the problem.

Commissioner South stated her desire to reconvene the Jail Committee and add representatives from County Court and the three municipal courts.

Upon further discussion, it was determined to reconvene the Jail Committee to review the overcrowding situation and present their findings and recommendations to the Board for consideration.

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board entered into executive session at 11:36 a.m. to discuss specific personnel within Facilities Management pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22 (G)(1) and exited at 12:21 p.m.
