Lauren Cavanaugh, Human Services Director, was present for a work session to discuss an opportunity to apply for TANF Summer Youth Employment funding in Warren County.

Mrs. Cavanaugh stated that she has been working with Karen Whittamore and staff from Ohio Means Jobs Warren County to develop a program similar to their summer youth program where Warren County could receive a special allocation of TANF dollars to employ youth between the ages of 14 and 24 during the summer. She stated that the size of the program would be dependent upon the amount of the allocation.

Mrs. Cavanaugh stated that the program could run from May 1<sup>st</sup> to October 31<sup>st</sup> and if the allocation is sufficient, with the approval of the Board, she would probably need to employ a temporary coordinator to ensure the program runs properly.

Mrs. Cavanaugh then stated that, if approved, the youth would be employees of the Warren County Educational Services Center, similar to the way they employ substitute teachers on behalf of local school districts.

Mrs. Cavanaugh stated that with the knowledge and employer contacts of Ohio Means Jobs Warren County, she envisions this program to help in three different ways:

- 1. Working with the Child Support Enforcement Agency, they could identify young parents that are not employed and not meeting their child support obligations and utilize this program to help them with employment.
- 2. In certain instances, the summer youth that are 18 years of age or older, are retained as permanent employees, helping them become self sufficient and removing them from the assistance rolls.
- 3. Helping youth to learn the value and importance of working and providing them with the confidence that comes with earning a paycheck.

Upon discussion, the Board stated their support of the program.

Linda Oda, Warren County Recorder, was present to review the Warren County Recorder 2013 Annual Report.

Mrs. Oda presented the annual report (attached) and reviewed the statistics included within the report. She then gave an update relative to the new software that is up and running and reported

that the feedback she has received from the public and title abstractors is that they are pleased with the product.

There was discussion relative to the "glitch" that Warren County uses 11 numbers in the sidwell as compared to other counties as well as the standard procedure that a sidwell only has ten numbers.

Matt Nolan, Chief Deputy Auditor, stated that the purpose of the 11<sup>th</sup> number is relative to distribution of tax revenues if the parcel is taxed in a different manner such as parcels located within a TIF area.

Mrs. Oda reported that the vendor for the new software program is working on a "patch" to the program so the 11<sup>th</sup> number is automatically dropped when searching for information utilizing a sidwell number.

Mrs. Oda and Rodney Everson, Veterans Commission Director, reported that all of the DD-214's have been digitized and that the two offices are working together to provide Soldier Discharge Identification Cards at no charge to Warren County veterans.

Tony Brigano, Probate-Juvenile Court Administrator, was present to explain the need to terminate the current agreement with Justice Benefits, Inc. as they begin to provide the services in-house rather than through an outside vendor.

Mr. Brigano stated that they need to terminate the current agreement but are requesting the Board to approve a new agreement to provide a random moment study which is required in order to receive state and federal funds for their programs.

Upon further discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #14-0457) to terminate the agreement with Justice Benefits, Inc. on behalf of Warren County Juvenile Court and authorize Court Administrator to sign documents relative thereto and (Resolution #14-0458) to approve and enter into an agreement with Justice Benefits, Inc. on behalf of Warren County Juvenile Court for professional services of Random Moment Time Study ("RMS Only Client").

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board entered into executive session at 11:10 a.m. to discuss personnel matters relative to discipline and hiring within Emergency Services, Telecommunications and the Water and Sewer Department pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22 (G)(1) and exited at 1:00 p.m.

# Welcome

Warren County Recorder's Office is pleased to present its first Annual Report to Warren County. It is our hope that you find the statistics and information in these pages interesting and useful.

In the book *The Mystery of Capital*, Hernando de Soto proclaims the reason for the success of the United States and capitalism is its carefully documented records and guarding of its land records to ensure personal property rights. He notes the reason many countries are not as successful as the United States of America is because:

- A lack of credible public records prevents countries, businesses and individuals from leveraging an important source of capital;
- There are countries where more than 75% of the population have no proof they own their homes or property;
- · More than \$9 trillion of capital exists in undocumented homes across the world.

The lands records system, including the Sidwell numbering system adopted by Warren County in the late 1970s, keeps the knowledge of property ownership easily accessible to everyone. Every day, dozens of people use the Warren County Recorder's office to research their property lines, confirm ownership, acquire documents to prove their legal status, etc.

Linda Oda became the 24th person elected to the position of the Warren County Recorder in the past 210 years when she took office January 2, 2013. Since then, she has implemented several changes, including:

- Updated the office's software to a state-of-the art land record system from the previous in-house DOS-based system which was created in 1980;
- · Introduced Property Fraud Alert (see page 6);
- Reduced staff from 13 full-time employees to 9 full-time and one part-time employee, saving taxpayers tens of thousands of dollars.
- · Credit card payments now accepted.

Like any successful office, the Warren County Recorder's office will continue to evolve as it finds better, more efficient ways to complete its responsibilities to Warren County and its taxpayers. # GOALS MET IN 2013



The Ohio Department of Development Services recently released information on where some of the money Warren County contributes to the Ohio Housing Trust Authority is spent. Money that has come back to Warren County includes:


- → In 2011, People Working Cooperatively received an \$800,000 grant to provide emergency home repairs/handicapped accessibility modifications for homeowners with incomes at or below 35 percent of the area median income in Butler, Clermont, Hamilton and Warren Counties. The program assisted 475 households consisting of 1,045. Contact: (513) 351-7921.
- In 2010, the Council of Aging of Southwestern Ohio received a \$400,000 grant to provide emergency home repairs and handicapped accessibility modifications for homeowners, age 60 and older, with incomes at or below 35 percent of the area median income in Butler, Clermont, Clinton, Hamilton and Warren Counties. The program assisted 319 households consisting of 382 persons. Contact: (513) 721-1025.
- In 2010, New Housing Opportunities received a \$358,000 grant to operate a 14-bed emergency shelter for men and women and to provide supportive services; and provide transitional housing and supportive services to persons suffering from a mental illness or recovering from substance abuse and with incomes at or below 35 percent of the area median income. The emergency shelter program assisted 195 households consisting of 250 persons and the transitional housing program will assist 23 households consisting of 37 persons. Contact: (513) 336-8897.
- In 2010, Warren Metropolitan Housing Authority received a \$226,800 grant to provide transitional housing and supportive services to families with incomes at or below 35 percent of the area median income. The program assisted 140 households consisting of 300 persons. Contact: (513) 695-1226.
