#### PUBLIC HEARING

#### 2019 TAX BUDGET

Martin Russell, Deputy County Administrator, was present for the public hearing to consider the 2019 Tax Budget.

Mr. Russell presented the Tax Budget and reviewed the following:

Mr. Russell discussed receipts as of June 30, 2018, and stated that revenue is on track to collect the proposed \$80 million for the Jail project over the next five years. He then stated that the estimated \$80 million in revenue with the historical 94% expenditure of appropriation should allow sufficient carryover to fund the Children Services required increase.

Upon further discussion, the Board closed the public hearing and resolved (Resolution #18-1106) to approve the 2019 Tax Budget as presented.

Dr. Steven Johnson, Sinclair Community College, was present along with Madelyn Isle and Scott Markland, Sinclair Community College, and Nathaniel Armstrong, Sinclair Student.

Dr. Johnson stated that Sinclair is in their 131<sup>st</sup> year of operation and just graduated the highest number of students in the history of operation. He then presented the attached PowerPoint Presentation and invited the Board to participate in the upcoming Strategic Review and Visioning Meeting to take place July 18, 2018, at the Mason Campus and thanked the Board for their many years of support.

Mr. Markland reviewed the total awarded scholarships to Warren County residents from this Board of \$560,991 presented to 5331 students since 2007. He then discussed the 2-year Mechatronics apprenticeship program as well as the partnership with Festo where the Sinclair Lab at Festo RSC is located. He then updated the Board on Sinclair staff's professional development trip to Germany.

Nathaniel Armstrong, Mason High School 2017 graduate and student in the apprenticeship program, discussed his experiences with the program and stated he is on track to graduate in May 2019.

Dr. Johnson presented background on how Sinclair Community College first came to Warren County and the integral part that Barney Wright, former Chairman of the Sinclair Community College Board of Directors played in the process. He then presented a plaque to Mr. Wright to commemorate the Bernard H. Wright Center at the Courseview Campus.

The Board then presented the 2018 scholarship check to the Sinclair representatives.

Upon final discussion, Mr. Wright thanked the Board of Commissioners for the opportunity to serve on the Sinclair Board of Trustees.

#### PUBLIC HEARING

CONSIDER AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WARREN COUNTY WATER AND SEWER DEPARTMENT RELATIVE TO TRANSITIONING OF THE COLLECTION OF BACKFLOW PREVENTION PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION FEE FROM THE WARREN COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT TO THE WARREN COUNTY WATER AND SEWER DEPARTMENT

This Board met this 10<sup>th</sup> day of July 2018, in the Commissioners Meeting Room to consider amendments to the Rules and Regulations of the Warren County Water and Sewer Department relative to transferring the collection of the \$25.00 annual implementation fee from the Warren County Combined Health District to the Warren County Water and Sewer Department with the fee being applicable to Warren County's customers that are required to be enrolled in the mandatory Backflow Prevention Program.

Mr. Brausch reviewed the purpose of the backflow prevention program and the process and the steps being implemented to comply with the Ohio EPA Regulations. He then requested the Board to approve the required amendments to the Rules and Regulations.

There being no one present to speak in opposition to the proposed amendments, the Board closed the public hearing and resolved (Resolution #18-1107) to approve the amendments.

Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer, was present for a work session along with Gus Edwards, Wayne Township Administrator, to discuss the proposed boundary map of the Waynesville Regional Wastewater Treatment Service Area.

Mr. Brausch presented the attached maps relative to the preliminary areas to be considered during a public hearing to establish the area.

There was discussion relative to the incorporated areas of Waynesville and Harveysburg being included as well as areas within Wayne Township that gravity flow to the treatment plant.

Commissioner Jones stated that the proposed map is a good starting point for consideration at the public hearing.

Commissioner Grossmann suggested the inclusion of the small areas that are within the township that are completely surrounded by the incorporated areas.

Upon discussion, the Board stated their concurrence to the utilization of the proposed maps for consideration during the public hearing to establish the sanitary sewer service area.

Upon motion the meeting was adjourned.
