DISCUSSIONS

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board accepted and approved the consent agenda.

Martin Russell, Assistant County Administrator, was present along with Sheriff Larry Sims and staff as well as representatives from Wachtel & McAnally and Granger Construction relative to the quarterly update for the New Warren County Jail Project.

Garry McAnally, Wachtel & McAnally, presented updated schematic designs (attached) of the location of the building as well as the intersection of Justice Drive and Memorial Drive. He discussed the cost estimates associated with both a roundabout and a traditional intersection. He then stated the determinations that a roundabout would be too costly at this time and recommended the traditional intersection with the ability to make the change in the future.

Jason Woehrle, Granger Construction, discussed the conceptual estimate (attached) based upon the latest schematic design that includes an expanded kitchen in order to accommodate future expansions. He then reviewed the proposed timeline as follows:

February 5, 2019 Present estimate on design development drawings

July 9, 2019 Present guarantee maximum price

July 22, 2019 Begin project construction with a 22 month estimated completion

There was then discussion relative to the desire for an early guarantee maximum price for the road reconstruction portion of the project in order to begin road improvements immediately upon the release of students for summer break.

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Upon motion the meeting was adjourned.






