## **PUBLIC HEARING #1**

CONSIDER THE ADOPTION OF WARREN COUNTY RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE DESIGN OF STORM SEWER AND STORMWATER MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS

The first public hearing to consider the adoption of new Warren County Rules and Regulations for the Design of Storm Sewer and Stormwater Management Systems was convened this 4<sup>th</sup> day of December 2018.

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Neil Tunison, County Engineer, presented the proposed new regulations and stated the changes are being made to align with the State of Ohio stormwater permit process for pollution control. He stated that with the adoption, they will begin reviewing a pollution prevention plan.

Mr. Tunison discussed the new regulations addressing stormwater pollution prevention plans but that design standards are not a part of these regulations. He then stated he has contacted the Homebuilders Associations of both Cincinnati and Dayton but has had no comment from either.

The Board reviewed the requirement of holding two (2) public hearings prior to the adoption of the new regulations.

Bruce McGary, Assistant Prosecutor, discussed the required process for adoption and noted for the record that representatives from both Hamilton and Clearcreek Townships were present in support of the regulations.

Upon further discussion, the public hearing was closed.

Commissioner Jones discussed her concern relative to a reduction in the per diem rate of \$6 for foster parents who utilize daycare assistance. She stated her request to the Children Services Director to review the cost to change in policy to eliminate the reduction. She then stated that the Director determined the cost to be an additional \$12,000 - \$13,000 per year.

Commissioner Jones stated that with the need to encourage fostering, she desires to change the policy to eliminate the per diem reduction.

Commissioner Grossmann stated he has no objection to changing the policy and would like to address the matter further upon Commissioner Young's return from vacation.

Upon motion the meeting was adjourned.
