## DISCUSSIONS

On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board accepted and approved the consent agenda.

The Board continued the discussion from the previous meeting relative to the notice of intent from the City of Middletown to create the Sawyer's Mill Project I Incentive District.

Commissioner Young discussed what he believes to be the role of government as it pertains to incentivizing economic development as well as the need for balanced growth. He stated his concern with the setting of a precedent by encouraging residential growth at the expense of the developmental disabilities population, the elderly, those in need of mental health services as well as others that would lose levy funding with the creation of this incentive district. He then stated that he does not fault the City of Middletown for their intent to encourage this project but he does not support this residential incentive district.

Commissioner Grossmann questioned why Middletown would want to help subsidize a developer.

Commissioner Jones stated her agreement with Commissioner Young to not encourage residential development at the expense of levy funds for needed services. She stated there are other ways to incentivize residential development without using levy funds.

Upon further discussion, the Board resolved (Resolution #19-1196) to object to the creation of the Sawyer's Mill Project I Incentive District within the City of Middletown.
