On motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the Board accepted and approved the consent agenda.

PUBLIC HEARING

CONTINUATION OF THE PUBLIC HEARING CONSIDER MODIFICATIONS TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WATER AND SEWER DEPARTMENT RELATIVE TO INCREASES TO WATER AND SEWER RATES, FEES, AND CHARGES

The continuation of the public hearing to consider modifications to the Rules and Regulations of the Water and Sewer Department relative to rates, fees, and charges for 2024, 2025, and 2026 was convened this 27th day of February 2024 in the Commissioners' Meeting Room.

Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer, presented the attached PowerPoint presentation stating the

recommended user rates for water and sewer services and the impact the increase will have on revenue.

There was discussion relative to the operation and improvement projects cost to maintain and improve water and sewer service within the county.

Commissioner Young stated our current system is aging and further stated the need to address repair issues and correct them right away.

There was discussion relative to the increase of tap-in fees and the possibility of grandfathering current rates for recorded plats or preliminary development plans existing prior to the proposed rate change.

Greg Burling, President of Cincinnati Home Builders Association, stated he understands the need for a fee increase. Mr. Burling requested that the proposed fee increase would not apply to lots that are already a part of approved preliminary plans.

There was further discussion relative to preexisting plats and preliminary development plans being grandfathered into the current rates and what type of properties would be included.

Upon further discussion, on motion, upon unanimous call of the roll, the public hearing was closed.

Chris Brausch, Sanitary Engineer, was present to discuss the water main replacement project along State Route 48 in Maineville. Mr. Brausch presented the attached PowerPoint presentation stating the chronic problem, problem areas, and request to expedite the improvement project.

There was discussion relative to the urgency of completing the improvement project and the proper procedure to expedite it.

Gus Bunnell, 8111 State Route 48 Maineville, Ohio, stated his property has been damaged by the frequent watermain breaks near his home. Mr. Bunnell stated that his insurance company has only reimbursed him for a portion of the damage repairs.

There was discussion relative to what is permissible by law for reimbursement by the county to Mr. Bunnell for his home damage repairs.

Bruce McGary, Prosecuting Attorney advised the Board to evaluate the situation prior to proceeding with action.










Affordable Water Rates






