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RAIL: Use W-Beam rail meeting AASHTO M 180 Type II Class A, as specified in CMS 606.

NOTES

POSTS: Posts may be constructed of wood or steel. Wood posts may be round or 6''x8'' square-sawed.

Use round wood posts on runs of single-sided rail. The round posts shall be 8″±1 in diameter at the top and not more than 3″ larger at the butt with a uniform taper.

Fabricated wood posts with square ends. Posts shall be pressure-treated as per CMS 710.14. Bore bolt holes and, if required, trim the tops of posts after the posts are set.

Steel posts are to be W6x9 or W6x8.5 galvanized steel. Use the same type of post throughout the length of the project unless otherwise specified in the plans or permitted by the Engineer.

All posts are 6'-0" long unless specified otherwise in the Contract Document. Posts may be set in drilled holes or may be driven to grade.

WELDED BEAM POSTS: Welded beam guardrail posts may be used for Item 606, Guardrail, provided the web and flange sizes are as shown here. Welding of the web to the flanges must comply with ASTM A 769, Class 1, using Grade 36 steel [250 MPa yield point] with the following exceptions:

- Sec. 7.2 Test reports of tensile properties for each lot shall accompany each shipment.
- Sec. 12 Beams that have imperfections repaired by welding shall not be accepted for use in Item 606.
- ec. i3 Random samples shall be tested by the Department from materials delivered to the project site, or other locations designated by the Laboratory.

ALTERNATE POSTS: Engineered guardrail posts having met NCHRP 350 criteria, and listed on the **Office of Materials Management's** Approved List are permitted as an equal alternate when installed according to the Manufacturer's instructions and within the limitations shown on the Approved List.


BLOCKOUTS: Blockout dimensions are dependent on post used. Wood Blockouts are to be pressure treated as specified in CMS 710.14. Bore bolt holes. Approved alternate blockouts may be used in lieu of the wood blockouts shown. The approved list is maintained by the **Office of Roadway Engineering.**

WASHERS: Install appropriate sized standard galvanized steel washers on the nut side of bolts installed on wood posts.

DELINEATION: For barrier reflectors, see CMS 626.

Receipt and Opening of Bids: The Warren County Board of Commissioners (herein referred to as "Owner"), invites bids on the form attached hereto, all blanks of which must be appropriately filled in. Bids will be received by the Owner at the Office of the Warren County Board of Commissioners until 9:30 a.m., February 6, 2024, and then at said office publicly opened and read aloud. The envelopes containing the bids must be sealed, addressed to Warren County Board of Commissioners at 406 Justice Drive, Lebanon, Ohio 45036. Bids shall be submitted in a sealed envelope clearly marked "Bid Opening – the McClure Road Bridge #71-0.39 Rehabilitation Project, February 6, 2024 @ 9:30 a.m."

The Owner may consider informal any bid not prepared and submitted in accordance with the provisions hereof and may waive any informalities or reject any and all bids. Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the above scheduled time for the opening of bids or authorized postponement thereof. Any bid received after the time and date specified shall not be considered. No bidder may withdraw a bid within 60 days after the actual date of the opening thereof.

- 2. Withdrawal of Bid: A Bidder may withdraw his bid from consideration if the price bid was substantially lower than the other bids, provided the bid was submitted in good faith and the reason for the price being substantially lower was a clerical mistake as opposed to a judgment mistake and was actually due to an unintentional omission of a substantial quantity of work, labor or material made directly in the compilation of the bid. Bids may be modified or withdrawn by an appropriate document duly executed (in the manner that a bid must be executed) and delivered to the place where bids are to be submitted at any time prior to the opening of bids.

The Owner invites unit price bids for the construction described in the plans and specifications. These unit prices shall be extended by estimated quantities to develop a total price for the project.

The Owner reserves the right to reject any bid if the evidence submitted by, or investigation of, such bidder fails to satisfy the Owner that such bidder is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and to complete the work contemplated therein; conditional bids will not be accepted.
- 6. <u>Bid Security</u>: Each bid must be accompanied by cash, certified check of the bidder, letter of credit equal to ten (10) percent of the bid, or a bid bond prepared on the form of bid bond attached hereto, duly executed by the bidder as principal and having as surety thereon a surety company approved by the Owner. (See Invitation to Bidders for required amounts) Such cash, checks or bid bonds will be returned to bidders after the Owner has awarded the bid and has executed the contract, or, if no award has been made within 60 days after the date of the opening of bids, upon demand of the bidder at any time thereafter, so long as he/she has not been notified of the acceptance of his/her bid.
- 7. Liquidated Damages for Failure to Enter into Contract: Submission of a bid shall be a representation by the Contractor that it has fully reviewed and is familiar with the Contract and all contract documents as defined in the contract and will execute the contract if awarded the bid. The successful bidder, upon his/her failure or refusal to execute and deliver the Contract (attached hereto) and required bonds within 10 days after he/she has received notice of the acceptance of his/her bid, shall forfeit to the Owner, as liquidated damages for such failure or refusal, the security deposited with his/her bid.
- 8. <u>Time of Completion and Liquidated Damages</u>: Bidder must agree to commence work on or before a date to be specified in a written "Notice to Proceed" of the Owner and to fully complete project 12 weeks after the start of construction. The completion date may be extended in the event of adverse weather conditions. Bidder must agree also to pay as liquidated damaged the sum of \$400.00 for each consecutive calendar day thereafter.

- 9. NO DAMAGE FOR DELAY: No payment, compensation or adjustment of any kind shall be made to the contract price for damages incurred by the contractor because of hindrances or delays in the progress of the work from any cause that is not proximately caused by the Owner's action or failure to act. Whether such hindrances or delays are avoidable or unavoidable, the contractor agrees that he or she will make no claim for compensation, damages, or mitigation of liquidated damages for any such delays. Examples of delays include (but are in no manner limited to) obtaining all necessary permission from any government agency or any private party, any act or failure to act by any other contractor, subcontractor and/or supplier, all foreseen and unforeseen events and any conditions or acts of God. It is understood and agreed that the contractor assumes all risks of delays in prosecuting or completing the work under the contract that are not proximately caused by the Owner's action or failure to act. The contractor will accept in full satisfaction for such delays, an extension of time, if any, agreed to by the Owner.
- 10. Conditions of Work: Each bidder must inform him/herself fully of the conditions relating to the construction of the project and the employment of labor thereon. Failure to do so will not relieve a successful bidder of his/her obligation to furnish all material and labor necessary to carry out the provisions of his/her contract. Insofar as possible the contractor, in carrying out the work, must employ such methods or means or will not cause any interruption of or interference with the work of any other contractor.
- 11. Addenda and Interpretations: No interpretation of the meaning of the plans, specifications or other pre-bid documents will be made to any bidder orally. Every request for such interpretation must be in writing and addressed to: Roy Henson, Warren County Engineer's Office, 210 West Main Street, Lebanon, Ohio, 45036, and to be given consideration must be received at least five days prior to the date fixed for the opening of bids. All such interpretations and any supplemental instructions will be in the form of written addenda to the specifications which, if issued, will be mailed by certified mail with return receipt requested to all prospective bidders (at the respective addresses furnished for such purposes), no later than three days prior to the date fixed for the opening of bids. Failure of any bidder to receive any such addendum or interpretations shall not relieve such bidder from any obligation under his/her bid as submitted. All addenda so issued shall become part of the contract documents.
- 12. <u>Security for Faithful Performance</u>: Simultaneously with the delivery of the executed Contract, the Contractor shall furnish payment and performance bonds as security for faithful performance of this contract and for the payment of all subcontracts, suppliers and laborers performing labor on the project under the Contract and furnishing materials in connection with the Contract.

The surety on such bond or bonds shall be a duly authorized surety company satisfactory to the Owner. Please note that upon execution of the Contract if a Bid Guaranty/Contract Bond was submitted with your original bid a Performance Bond will not be required.

- 13. <u>Power of Attorney</u>: Attorneys-in-fact who sign bid bonds or contract bonds must file with each bond a certified and effectively dated copy of their power of attorney.
- 14. <u>Laws and Regulations</u>: The bidder's attention is directed to the fact that all applicable State laws, municipal ordinances, and the rules and regulations of all authorities having jurisdiction over construction of the project shall apply to the contract throughout, and they will be deemed to be included in the contract the same as though herein written out in full.
- 15. <u>Method of Award</u>: The Owner may reject all bids or may award the contract on the base bid or on the base bid combined with additions or deductible alternates as produces a net

amount which is within the available funds. To determine lowest and best bidder, the price of the bid will be given equal weight against the totality of the following factors: 1.) the bidder's information provided in the Section Experience Statement which shall be used to judge responsibility, experience, skill, financial standing, feedback from references or prior clients—which may include Owner; 2.) the Exception Sheet; 3.) availability, proximity, and familiarity to job site."

- 16. Obligation of Bidder: At the time of the opening of bids each bidder will be presumed to have inspected the site and to have read and to be thoroughly familiar with the plans and contract documents (including all addenda). The failure or omission of any bidder to examine any form, instrument or document shall in no way relieve any bidder from any obligation in respect of his/her bid.
- 17. <u>Safety Standards and Accident Prevention:</u> With respect to all work performed under this contract, the Contractor shall:
 - a. Comply with the safety standards provisions of applicable laws, building and construction codes and the "Manual of Accident Prevention in Construction" published by the Associated General Contractors of America, the requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (Public Law 91-596), and the requirements of title 29 of the code of Federal Regulations, Section 1518 as published in the "Federal Register", Volume 36, N. 75, Saturday, April 17, 1971.
 - b. Exercise every precaution at all times for the prevention of accidents and the protection of persons (including employees) and property.
 - c. Maintain at his/her office or other well-known place at the job site, all articles necessary for giving first aid to the injured and shall make standing arrangements for the immediate removal to a hospital or doctor's care of persons (including employees) who may be injured at the job site. In no case shall employees be permitted to work at a job site before the employer has made a standing arrangement for removal of injured persons to a hospital or a doctor's care.
- 18. Examination of Site: Each bidder shall and is hereby directed to inspect the entire site of the proposed work and judge for him/herself as to all the circumstances affecting the cost and progress of the work and shall assume all patent and latent risks in connection therewith.
- 19. Soil Conditions: Subject to the convenience of the Owner, prospective bidders will be permitted to explore the site by making borings or digging test pits. In such event, the work shall be done at the sole expense and risk of the bidder, and he/she shall maintain and restore the site to original condition. The Owner does not guarantee the accuracy of any information or samples which it may have obtained from test borings or otherwise as to the kind or condition of the soil that may be encountered in the prosecution of the proposed work, neither does the Owner represent that the plans and specifications drawn are based upon any data so obtained. The Owner does not make any representation as to the soil which may be encountered or of soil or water which underlies the work or is adjacent thereto, including any difficulties that may be due to quicksand, or other unfavorable conditions that may be encountered in the work, whether apparent upon surface inspection or disclosed in the process of carrying forward the work.
- 20. <u>Water Supply:</u> All water for construction purposes, as well as the expense of having water conveyed about the work, must be provided by the Contractor and the cost of this work shall

be included in the unit prices stipulated for the various items of the work to be done under this contract.

- 21. <u>Working Facilities</u>: The plans show, in the general manner, the existing structures and the land available for construction purposes. The bidders must satisfy themselves of the conditions and difficulties that may be encountered in the execution of the work at this site.
- 22. <u>Permits</u>: The Contractor shall take out all necessary permits from the proper authorities and shall give all notices required by law or ordinance. The charge or fee for any permit issued by the proper authority shall be borne by the contractor.
- 23. <u>Signature of Bidders</u>: The firm, corporate or individual name of the bidder must be signed in ink in the space provided for the signatures on the proposed blanks. In the case of a corporation, the title of the officer signing must be stated, and such officer must be thereunto duly authorized and the seal of said corporation duly affixed. In the case of a partnership, the signature of at least one of the partners must follow the firm name, using the term "member of the firm." In the case of an individual, use the terms "doing business as", or "sole owner." The bidder shall further state in his/her proposal the name and address of each person or corporation interested therein.
- 24. <u>Right to Accept or Reject Proposals</u>: The Owner may consider informal and may reject any bid not prepared and submitted in accordance with the provisions hereof. The Owner reserves the right to reject all bids, to waive any informalities or irregularities in the bids received, and to accept any bid which is deemed lowest and best.
- 25. <u>Non-Collusion Affidavit</u>: The successful bidder will be required to submit a non-collusion affidavit on the form included in these Bid/Contract documents (Section C). This affidavit shall be dated and executed as part of this bid.
- 26. <u>EEO Compliance:</u> Bidders, please see Section J for EEO Compliance Requirements and Affidavit.
- 27. <u>Prevailing Wage Rates:</u> This Project is subject to Prevailing Wage Requirements. In the event that the rate of wages paid for any trade or occupant in the locality where such work is being performed are under current collective agreements or understandings between bona fide organizations of labor and employer, then the wages to be paid shall be not less than such agreed wage rates, nor less than the minimum rates compiled by the Federal Labor Standard Act. A copy of these prevailing wage rates has been included in these specifications as Exhibit L. Every Contractor and Subcontractor who is subject to Ohio Revised Code, Chapter 4115 shall, as soon as he/she begins performance under his/her contract with the Owner, supply the Prevailing Wage Coordinator for the Owner a schedule of the dates on which he/she is required to pay wages to employees. He/She shall also deliver to the Prevailing Wage Coordinator within three weeks after each pay date, a certified copy of his/her payroll which shall exhibit for each employee paid any wages, name, current address, social security number, number of hours worked each day of the pay period and the total for each week, hourly rate of pay, job classification, fringe payments, and deductions from wages. The certification of each payroll shall be executed by the Contractor, Subcontractor, or duly appointed agent thereof and shall recite that the payroll is correct and complete and that the wage rate shown is not less than those required by the contract.

In case the Owner orders the Contractor to perform extra or additional work which may make it necessary for the Contractor or any Subcontractor under this contract to employee a person not herein specified, the Owner will include in the contract change order for such extra or additional work, a minimum wage rate for such trade or occupation, and insofar as such extra or additional work is concerned, there shall be paid to each employee engaged in work of such trade or occupation, not less than the wage so included. Insofar as possible, local labor shall be employed on this work.

- 28. Subletting of Contract: The Contractor shall not sublet, sell, transfer, or assign any portion of the contract without written consent of the Owner or his/her designated agent. When such consent is given, the Contractor will be permitted to sublet a portion thereof, but shall perform with his/her own organization, work amounting to no less than fifty percent of the total contract cost, except that any time designated in the contract before computing the amount of work required to be performed by the Contractor with his/her own organization, No subcontract, or transfer of contract, shall in any way release the Contractor of his/her liability under the contract and bonds.
- 29. Required Insurance: In accordance with the specifications, the Contractor, without restricting the obligations and liabilities assumed under the Contract Documents, shall at his/her own cost and expense purchase and maintaining in force until final acceptance of his/her work, the forms of insurance coverage listed below.

Certificates from the insurance carrier stating the limits of liability and expiration date shall be filed with the Owner before operations are begun. Such certificates shall not merely name the types of policy provided but **shall specifically refer to this Contract** and shall name the Board of Warren County Commissioners as additionally insured. However, the original policy for Owner's Protective Bodily Injury (Item D) and Property Damages (Item E) shall at this time be delivered to the Owner for its possession.

All policies as hereinafter required shall be so written that the Owner will be notified of cancellation or restrictive amendment at least ten days prior to the effective date of such cancellation or amendment.

Item A - Workers Compensation and/or Employer's liability Insurance as required or specified by State Law.

Item B – Comprehensive General Liability Insurance: In an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence for Bodily Injury and \$500,000 for explosion underground and collapse, commonly known as "XCU." The following endorsement documents provided by Warren County:

- b. CG 20 37 10 01 additional insured endorsement (or equivalent)

General Liability needs to be written on Primary/Non-contributory basis for the benefit of the additional insured.

Item C – Umbrella: In an amount not less than \$1,000,000 occurrence and \$1,000,000 aggregate. Umbrella needs to attach to General Liability, Employers Liability, Auto Liability. Umbrella needs to be written on follow-form primary.

Item D - Bodily Injury Liability Insurance covering motor vehicles either owned by the Contractor or being used in connection with the prosecution of the work embraced under this contract.

Item E - Property Damage Liability Insurance covering motor vehicles either owned by the Contractor or being used in connection with the prosecution of the work embraced under this contract.

Item F - (If Applicable) - Such Protective (including Railroad Protective) and Contractual Bodily Injury Liability Insurance and such Protective (including Railroad Protective) and Contractual Property Damage Liability Insurance as shall be required by the railroad and other utility companies whose property, facilities or rights-of-way may be affected by the work to be done under this contract, in such amounts and in such form as each such utility company may require.

If any part of the work is sublet, insurance of the same types and limits as required by above items numbered A, B, C, D, E, and F shall be provided by or on behalf of the Subcontractors to cover that part

of the work they have contracted to perform including Property Damage Liability Special Hazards coverage if so required by this contract.

Protective and Contractual Bodily Injury Liability Insurance required by Item F (if applicable) shall be in an amount and form as each railroad or utility company may require.

<u>Builders Risk Insurance</u>: All Risk form, including subsidence and theft of materials from the job site. Such coverage shall be maintained until final acceptance of the Contract by the Owner and payable to the Owner for the benefit of the contractor. The limit for Builders Risk shall be the full value of construction.

- 30. Maintenance of Rights-Of-Way: All construction as proposed along all City, Township, County, State and Federal roads including storage and stockpiling of materials, is to be conducted within the limits of the public right-of-way. Bracing sheeting and shoring shall be used to keep all construction work within the construction limits unless work agreements are secured from the adjacent property Owners. It is the Contractor's responsibility to secure these work agreements, if deemed necessary. Copies of the work agreements shall be delivered to the Engineer and Owner prior to any work beginning on the affected property.
- 31. <u>Lights, Signs and Barricades</u>: Lights, signs and barricades shall be used to maintain traffic and safety for vehicular and pedestrian traffic during the course of this contract and shall be the sole responsibility of the Contractor.

32. Foreign Corporation and Contractors:

Foreign Corporations

Definition: "Foreign Corporation" means a corporation incorporated under the laws of another state. No contract shall be entered into with a foreign corporation until the Secretary of State has certified that such corporation is authorized to do business in Ohio: and until, if the bidder so awarded the Contract is a person or partnership, it has filed with the Secretary of State a Power of Attorney designating the Secretary of State as its agent for the purpose of accepting service of summons in any action brought under Ohio Revised Code, Section 153.05 or under Sections 4123.01 to 4123.94, inclusive.

33. <u>Subcontracts:</u> Contractor shall provide an explanation as part of its bid package of all subcontractors intended to be used in performance of the work described in Part II, Section D. In the event the Owner does not object, Contractor may have such work performed by a subcontractor. Contractor shall bind every subcontractor to, and every subcontractor must

agree to be bound by the terms of, the Contract, as far as applicable to the subcontractor's work particularly pertaining to Prevailing Wages and EEO requirements. Nothing contained in the Agreement shall create any contractual relationship between any subcontractors and Owner, nor create any obligations on the part of the Owner to pay or see to the payment of any sums to any subcontractor.

34. Real and/or Personal Property Tax Affidavit: All bidders must complete the Real and/or Personal property tax affidavit (Section I) and submit with your bid. This section should be fully completed whether or not you as a vendor/contractor own property in Warren County, Ohio.

Public Authority Responsibilities ORC Chapter 4115: Wages and Hours on Public Works (Prevailing Wage Coordinator)

- 1. Before advertising for bids, contracting, or undertaking construction with its own forces, to construct a public improvement, the public authority shall have the Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of Industrial Compliance, Bureau of Wage and Hour Administration determine the prevailing rates of wages for workers employed on the public improvement. The wage determination must be included in the project specifications and printed on the bidding blanks where work is done by contract.
 - a) "New" construction has a threshold level of \$250,000.
 - b) "Reconstruction, enlargement, alteration, repair, remodeling, renovation, or painting" has a threshold level of \$75,000.
 - b) "New" construction that involves roads, streets, alleys, sewers, ditches and other works connected to toad or bridge construction has a threshold level of **884.314**.
 - d) "Reconstruction, enlargement, alteration, repair, temodeling, renovation, or painting" that involves roads, streets, alleys, sewers, ditches and other works connected to road or bridge construction has a threshold of \$25,261.
 - 1.) Thresholds are to be adjusted blennially by the Director of Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of Industrial Compliance, Bureau of Wage and Hour Administration.
 - ii.) Blennial adjustments to threshold levels are made according to the Price Deflator for Construction Index.
 United States Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census, but may not increase or decrease more than 3% for any year.
- 2. Every contract for public work shall contain a provision that each worker employed by the contractor or subcontractor, or other person about or upon the public work; must be paid the prevailing tare of wages.
- If contracts are not awarded or construction undertaken within minety days (90) from the date of the determination of the prevailing wage there shall be a re-determination of the wage rates before the contract is awarded.
- 4. Within seven (7) working that after the receipt of notification of a change in the prevailing wage rates, the public authority shall notify all affected contractors and subcontractors. If it is determined that a contractor or subcontractor has violated sections 4115.03 to 4115.16 of the Ohio Revised Code because they were not notified as required, the public nuthority is liable for any back wages, fines, damages, court costs and attorney's fees for the period of time covering the receipt of wage changes, until they give the required notice.
- No public authority shall award a contract for a public improvement to any contractor or subcontractor whose name appears on the list of debarred contractors. This list is filed with the Scoretary of State by the Ohio Department of Commerce Division of Industrial Compliance & Labor-Bureau of Wage and Hour Administration The filing of the notice of conviction with the segretary of state constitutes notice to all public authorities. These contractors are probabled from working on public improvements for periods ranging from one to three years. The list of debarred contractors can be located on the website www.com.ohio.gov/laws
- 6. A public authority must designate and appoint one of its own employees to serve as the Prevailing Wage Coordinator during the life of the contract for constructing the public improvement. A Prevailing Wage Coordinator must be appointed no later than ten days before the first payment of wages by contractors to employees working on the public improvement.

PREVAILING WAGE CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITIES This is a summary of prevailing wage contractors' responsibilities. For more detailed information please refer to Chapter 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code

General information

Ohlo's prevailing wage laws apply to all public improvements financed in whole or in pair by public funds when the total overall project cost is fairly estimated to be more than \$250,000 for new construction or \$75,000 for reconstruction, enlargement, alteration, repair, remodeling, renovation, or painting.

Ohio's prevailing wage laws apply to all public improvements financed in whole or in part by public funds when the total overall project cost is fairly estimated to be more than \$91,150 for new construction that involves roads, streets, alleys, sewers, ditches and other works connected to road or bridge construction or \$27,309 for reconstruction, enlargement, alteration, repair, remodeling, renovation, or painting of a public improvement that involves roads, streets, alleys, sewers, ditches and other works connected to road or bridge construction.

a) Thresholds are to be adjusted blennially by the Administrator of Ohlo Department of Commerce, Division of Industrial Compliance and Labor, Bureau of Wage and Hour Administration

Administration

b) Blenniel adjustments to threshold levels are made according to the Price Deflator for Construction Index, United States Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census*, but may not increase or decrease more than 3% for any year

Penalties for Violation

Violators are to be assessed the wages owed, plus a penalty of 100% of the wages owed.

Intentional Violations

If an intentional violation is determined to have occurred, the contractor is prohibited from contracting directly or indirectly with any public authority for the construction of a public improvement, intentional violation means "a willful, knowing, or deliberate disregard for any provision" of the prevailing wage law and includes but is not limited to the following actions:

 Intentional fallure to submit payroll reports as required, or knowingly submitting false or erroneous reports.

Intentional misclassification of employees for the purpose of reducing wages.


 Întentional misclassification of employees as independent contractors or as apprentices.

Intentional failure to pay the prevailing wage.

Intentional failure to comply with the allowable ratio of apprentices to skilled workers
as required by the regulations established by Ohio Department of Commerce.

Administration.

Intentionally employing an officer, of a contractor or subcontractor, that is known to be prohibited from contracting, directly or indirectly, with a public authority.

Responsibilities

A. Pay the prevailing rate of wages as shown in the wage rate schedules issued by the Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of Industrial Compliance and Labor, Bureau of Wage and Hour Administration, for the classification of work being

1. Wage rate schedules include all modifications, corrections, escalations, or reductions to wage rates issued for the project.


Overtime must be paid at time and one-half the employee's base hourly rate.

- Fringe benefits are paid at straight time rate for all hours including overtime. Prevailing wages must be paid in full without any deduction for food, lodging, transportation, use of tools, etc., unless, the employee has voluntarily consented to these deductions in writing. The public authority and the Director of Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of Industrial Compliance and Labor, Bureau of Wage and Hour Administration - must approve these deductions as fair and reasonable. Consent and approval must be obtained before starting the project.
- B. Use of Apprentices and Helpers cannot exceed the ratios permitted in the wage rate schedules.
 - 1. Apprentices must be registered with the U.S. Department of Labor Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training.
 - 2. Contractors must provide the Prevailing Wage Coordinator a copy of the Apprenticeship Agreement for each apprentice on the project.
- C. Keep full and accurate payroll records available for inspection by any authorized representative of the Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of Industrial Compliance, and Labor, Bureau of Wage and Hour Administration or the contracting public authority, including the Prevailing Wage Goordinator. Records should include but are not limited to:

1. Time cards, time sheets, dally work records, etc.

2. Payroll ledger/journals and canceled checks/check register.

- 3. Fringe benefit records must include program, address, account number, & canceled checks.
- 4. Records made in connection with the public improvement must not be removed from the State for one year following the completion of the project.
- Out-of State Corporations must submit to the Ohio Secretary of State the full name and address of their Statutory Agent in Ohio.
- D. Prevalling Wage Rate Schedule must be posted on the lob site where it is accessible to all employees.
- E. Prior to submitting the initial payroll report, supply the Prevailing Wage Coordinator with your project dates to schedule reporting of your payrolls.
- F. Supply the Prevailing Wage Coordinator a list of all subcontractors including the name, address, and telephone number for each,
 - 1. Contractors are responsible for their subcontractors' compliance with requirements of Chapter 4116 of the Ohio Revised Code.

- G. Before employees start work on the project, supply them with written notification of their job classification, prevailing wage rate, frings benefit amounts, and the name of the Prevailing Wage Coordinator for the project. A copy of the completed signed notification should be submitted to Prevailing Wage Coordinator.
- H. Supply all subcontractors with the Prevailing Wage Rates and changes.
- Submit certified payrolls within two (2) weeks after the initial pay period. Payrolls must include the following information:

1. Employees names, addresses, and social security numbers.

a. Corporate officers/owners/partners and any salarled personnel who do physical work on the project are considered employees. All rate and reporting requirements are applicable to these individuals.

2. Employees' work plassification.

a. Be specific about the laborers and/or operators (Group)

b. For all apprentices, show level/year and percent of journeymen's rate
 Hours worked on the project for each employee.

a. The number of hours worked in each day and the total number of hours worked each week.

4. Hourly rate for each employee.

- a. The minimum rate paid must be the wage rate for the appropriate classification. The Department's Wage Rate Schedule sets this rate.
- b. All overtime worked is to be paid at time and one-half for all hours worked more than forty (40) per week.

5. Where fringes are paid into a bona fide plan instead of cash, list each benefit and amount per hour paid to program for each employee.

a. When the amount contributed to the fringe benefit plan and the total number of hours worked by the employee on all projects for the year are documented, the hourly amount is calculated by dividing the total contribution of the employer by the total number of hours worked by the employee.

b. When the amount contributed to the fringe benefit is documented but not the total hours worked, the hourly amount is calculated by dividing the

total yearly contribution by 2080.

Gross amount earned on all projects during the pay period.

Total deductions from employee's wages.

Net amount paid.

- J. The reports shall be certified by the contractor, subcontractor, or duly appointed agent stating that the payroll is correct and complete; and that the wage rates shown are not less than those required by the O.R.C. 4115.
- K. Provide a Final Affidavit to the Prevailing Wage Coordinator upon the completion of the project.

PREVAILING WAGE NOTIFICATION to EMPLOYEE

41/5.05... The contractor of subcontrator shall furnish each employee NOT covered by a collective bargaining agreement written polification of the job classification to which the employee is assigned, the prevailing wage determined to be applicable to that classification, separated into the body rate of pay and the fringe payments, and the identity of the prevailing wage coordinator appointed by the public authority. The contractor or subcontractor shall furnish the same notification to each aftered employee every time the Job classification of the employee is changed.

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INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARING CERTIFIED PAYROLL REPORTS

General

Contractors and subcontractors are regulated by law to submit certified payroll reports for work on projects covered by Ohio's Prevailing Wage Law. Payroll Information by Column

- Employee Mame, Address and Social Security number: This information must be provided for all employees that perform physical labor on the project. Corporate officers, patriners, end salaried employees are considered employees and must be paid the prevailing rate. Includial sole proprietors do not have to pay themselves prevailing rate but must report their bours on the project.
- Work Class: List classification of work actually performed by employee. If unsure of work classification, consult the Ohio department of Commerce, Wage and Hour Bureau, Employees working more than one classification should have separate line entries for each classification, indicate what yearlievel for Apprentices. Be specific when using laborer and operator classifications; for example, Backhoe Operator or Asphalt Laborer.
- Hours Worked, Day & Date: In the first row of column 3 enter days of pay period example; M T W.TH.F S S. The second row is for the date that corresponds with each day for the pay period. In the employee information section enter the number of hours worked on the prevailing wass project and which day the hours were worked. Separate rows are tabeled for (ST) straight time hours and (OT) overtime hours. All hours worked after 40, must be pald at the appropriate overtime rate.
- 4. Project Total Hours: Total the flours entered for pay period.
- Pase Rate: Enter actual rate per hour paid to the employee. The overtime hourly rate is time and one-half the base rate listed in the prevailing wage schedule plus lifting benefit and one-half the base rate listed in the prevailing wage schedule last the base rate plus lifting benefit amounts. These amounts edded together actual prevailing wage rate. Employers must pay this total amount in one of three ways.

 a. Total rate may be paid in entirely in the pase rate to the employee; in which case, the cash designation will be checked for finde benefits;


 b. Total rate may be paid as listed in prevailing wage rate schedule with total finge amounts paid approved plans.

This wage determination is not intended as a blanket determination to be used for all projects during this period without prior approval of this Department.

Section 4115.04, Ohio Revised Code provides, in part: "Such schedule of wages shall be attached to and made a part of the specifications for the work, and shall be printed on the bidding blanks where the work is done by contract..."

The contract between the letting authority and the successful bidder shall contain a statement requiring that mechanics and laborers be paid a prevailing rate of wage as required in Section 4115.06, Ohio Revised Code.

The contractor or subcontractor is required to file with the contracting public authority upon completion of the project and prior to final payment therefore an affidavit stating that he has fully compiled with Chapter 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code.

The wage rates contained in this schedule are the "Prevailing Wages" as defined by Section 4115.03, Ohio Revised Code (the basic hourly rates plus certain fringe benefits). These rates and fringes shall be a minimum to be paid under a contract regulated by Chapter 4116 of the Ohio Revised Code by contractors and subcontractors. The prevailing wage rates contained in this schedule include the effective dates and wage rates currently on file, in cases where future effective dates are not included in this schedule, modifications to the wage schedule will be furnished to the Prevailing Wage Coordinator appointed by the public authority as soon as prevailing wage rates increases are received by this office.

There shall be posted in a prominent and accessible place on the site of work a legible statement of the Schedule of Wage Rates specified in the contract to the various classifications of laborers, workmen, and mechanics employed, said statement to remain posted during the life of such contract." Section 4115.07, Onto Revised Code.

Apprentices will be permitted to work only under a bona fide apprenticeship program if such program exists and if such program is registered with the Ohio Apprenticeship Council.

Section 4115.071 provides that no later than ten days before the first payment of wages is due to any employee of any contractor or subcontractor working on a contract regulated by Chapter 4115, Ohio Revised Gode, the contracting public authority shall appoint one of his own employees to act as the prevailing wage coordinator for said contract. The duties of the prevailing wage coordinator are outlined in Section 4115.071 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4115.05 provides for an escalator in the prevailing wage rate. Each time a new rate is established, that rate is required to be paid on all ongoing public improvement projects.

A further requirement of Section 4115.05 of the Ohio Revised Code is: *On the occasion of the first pay date under a contract, the contractor shall furnish each employee not govered by a collective bargaining agreement or understanding between employee and pone fide organizations of Labor with individual written notification of the lob classification to which the employee is assigned, the prevailing wage determined to be applicable to that classification, separated into the hourly rate of pay and the fringe payments, and the identity of the prevailing wage Coordinator appointed by the public authority. The contractor shall furnish the same notification to each effected employee every time the job classification of the employee is changed. the employee is changed."

Work performed in connection with the installation of modular furniture may be subject to prevailing wage.

SECTION M

SPECIAL PROVISIONS/TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS and ODOT'S LPA TEMPLATE REQUIRED CONTRACT PROVISIONS

The 2023 Ohio Department of Transportation Construction and Material Specifications and the Supplemental Specifications shall govern this project unless stated otherwise by the Warren County Engineer, herein referred to as "Engineer", "Project Engineer" and "County Engineer".

It is required that the bidder be an ODOT pre-qualified Contractor to complete the construction work required in these Bid Documents. The Contractor, Sub-Contractor, and Fabricators must meet or exceed the ODOT Minimum Skills Requirements for all Work Types involved in this project.

Conflicting Items in Bid Documents

Whenever the Technical Specifications and Bid Proposal Quantities differ from the Construction Plans, the Technical Specifications and Bid Proposal Quantities shall control for the bidding of this project.

Encouraging Diversity, Growth and Equity (EDGE) Requirements

Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 123.152, five percent (5%) of the awarded Contractor's bid must be subcontract to certified EDGE firms. EDGE certified firms are those who have been certified by the Ohio ODOT of Administrative Services. The Contractor must use its best efforts to solicit quotes from and to utilize EDGE subcontractors/suppliers on this project. Reference ODOT's 2023 LPA Template (Ohio) at the end of the special provisions/technical specifications for more details.

Construction Engineering and Project Inspection

The Warren County Engineer will provide all construction engineering and project inspection for the construction of this project.

Operations Schedule

The Contractor shall advise and coordinate all work with the Engineer. A detailed schedule of operations shall be furnished by the Contractor to the Engineer and shall list the order of operations and the time frame for the completion of each item of work. The Engineer and the Owner prior to the beginning of the work shall approve the schedule of operations. Changes to said schedule are to be issued in writing and approved by the Engineer before operations are changed or rescheduled. The Contractor shall schedule operations so that the improved areas have had sufficient time to cure, set and/or harden before the area is opened to traffic or use. The Contractor shall be responsible for the immediate repair of the improved area if any damage is done by traffic. The Contractor shall also be responsible for the immediate rectification of problems created in areas outside of the improved areas attributable to the failure of the improved area, i.e., the tracking of materials into unimproved areas.

Preconstruction Meeting

Prior to the commencement of the construction activities, the Warren County Engineer will arrange a meeting between the Contractor and the Warren County Engineer. The time, date, and location of said meeting will be determined after the awarding of the contract. All parties will be notified by the Warren County Engineer. At the preconstruction meeting the Contractor shall submit to the Project Manager a construction schedule, list of subcontractors, and list of suppliers.

Project Start Date

The Contractor shall begin the construction once a written notice-to-proceed has been given by the Board of Warren County Commissioners and a preconstruction meeting with the Warren County Engineer has been held. It is anticipated that construction will begin in the spring or summer of 2024.

Completion Time

All work shall be completed within 12 weeks after the written notice-to-proceed has been issued by the Board of Warren County Commissioners, a preconstruction meeting has been held, and construction has started. Liquidated damages for non-completion beyond the 12 weeks shall follow the CMS 108.07. Once work has started it shall be expected that work will be performed every work day on the project in an expeditious manner until the project is complete unless of inclimate weather.

Working Restrictions

No work shall be done between 6:00 p.m Friday and 7:00 a.m. Monday or during holidays, unless approved by the County Engineer. In addition, night work of any type shall be strictly prohibited, unless approved by the County Engineer.

Payment of Work

Contractor Estimates shall not be submitted more than once a month to the County Engineer for work included in the Contract between the County Commissioners and the Contractor. This project is a Federal to State Funding Exchange project which is similar to an ODOT LPA project based on paperwork, however ODOT will not be involved in the construction process. ODOT will make direct payments to the Contractor for 95% of construction costs and Warren County will make payments to the Contractor for 5% of the construction costs.

Prompt Payment and Payment Reporting

The contractor shall ensure prompt payment to subcontractors and material suppliers per Ohio Revised Code 4113.61. Furthermore, the Contractor must record each individual progress payment as well as each final payment to all subcontractors, service providers, and materials and

supplies vendors in such payment reporting system that ODOT shall indicate and in compliance with such timeframe that ODOT shall indicate.

Retainage and Affidavits

The contractor shall provide the County Engineer with affidavits stating that all subcontractors and suppliers for this project have been paid in full in accordance with CMS 109.08. A percentage of the original contract bid amount shall be retained on this project. Until 50% of the original contract has been performed, 8% of the amount of work performed will be retained. Once 50% of the contract has been performed and thereafter, a total of 4% of the original contract bid amount will be retained. The entire retainage will be released to the Contractor after the final inspection has been performed, after the County Engineer has accepted the construction, and after all affidavits have been submitted to the County Engineer by the Contractor.

Change Orders

No change orders involving performance or nonperformance contract quantities of project materials shall be processed without direct approval by the Warren County Engineer.

Storage of Construction Materials

The Contractor shall obtain prior approval of the Owner and/or Engineer for the locations to be used for the temporary storage of construction materials, tools, and/or machinery. All such materials, tools, and machinery shall be neatly and compactly piled in such a manner as to cause the least inconvenience to the property owners and to traffic. Under no circumstances shall existing drainage courses be blocked or water hydrants, valves, or meter pits covered.

Protection of Areas Outside of Work Limits

The Contractor shall be responsible for the protection of areas outside of the designated work limits, but which may be adjacent to those work limits. This will include those areas used by construction traffic for access to and from the work areas. Where the Engineer determines that the Contractor's operations have been responsible for damage to areas outside of the work limits, the Contractor shall be responsible for the repair of the area subject to the approval of the Engineer. No additional compensation will be due to the Contractor for any repair of these areas.

Instream Work

The Contractor shall not perform any excavation or place any fill material below the Ordinary High Water Elevation of Turtle Creek at the location of the bridge.

Debris Removal

The Contractor shall be responsible for removal from the site of all construction debris material. All debris material shall be disposed of in a proper manner and shall be as directed by any

applicable local, state or federal regulations. Contractor shall take precautions to avoid any demolition debris from entering the stream. Any material that does fall into the stream shall be removed as soon as possible.

Asbestos Notification

An asbestos survey of the existing Bridge #71-0.39 over Turtle Creek, SFN 8334439, was completed by a certified asbestos hazard evaluation specialist (CAHES) on 10/5/21. A copy of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency Notification of Demolition and Renovation form partially completed by Warren County and a copy of the asbestos survey will be provided to the Contractor at the preconstruction meeting. Although, asbestos abatement is not required, the Contractor shall finalize the form and submit it along with the necessary fee to the Ohio EPA, DAPC Asbestos Program, at least 10 days prior to demolition activities. A completed form and payment can be mailed to the Ohio EPA or it can be completed and paid online at the following website http://epa.ohio.gov/dapc/atu/asbestos. Payment for the work listed above as well as the Ohio EPA form fee shall be included in the Lump Sum bid price for Item 202 Portions of Structure Removed, As Per Plan.

Debris Containment

The Contractor shall prevent all material, bridge sealers, and other construction debris from falling into the stream during the entire project. Any material which falls into the stream shall be removed immediately.

Utility Notification

The Contractor shall notify at least 48 hours before breaking ground all public and/or private service corporation having wires, poles, conduits, manholes, or other structures that may be affected by the construction on this project, including all structures which are affected and not shown on the plans. Owners of underground utilities, which are members of OUPS, can be notified by calling 1-800-362-2764. Non-member underground utility owners must be called directly.

Utility Adjustments and Verification

The Contractor shall adjust to proposed grade all existing utility facilities, i.e. manholes, catch basins, valves, boxes, etc., prior to the commencement of paving operation. This shall include utility facilities, not shown on the plan, which may be found to be located within the pavement area. Work performed on the utility facilities shall be in strict accordance with the specifications of the applicable utility owner and shall be performed under the direction, supervision and inspection of said owner.

Existing Pipe

The location, size, type and depth of all existing pipe are shown as according to the best information. The Engineer will not be responsible for any variations found during construction. Where the plans provide for conduit to be connected to, or to cross either over or under, or close to an existing underground structure, it shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to locate the existing structure, both as to line and grade, before he starts to lay the proposed conduit, in order to assure compatibility of line and grade of the proposed conduit. Payment for all operations described above shall be included in the unit price bid for the pertinent conduit item.

Maintenance of Sewer Flows

The Contractor shall conduct his operations so as to maintain at all times storm water and sewer flows through existing facilities to remain in place and through existing facilities to be replaced until new facilities are completed and placed in use.

Testing of Construction Materials

The Engineer may select a testing firm for this project. The Engineer will notify the Contractor of the selected firm. The Engineer shall be responsible for the costs incurred in the testing of the construction materials both on site and at the plant. However, the Contractor shall note that he will be responsible for any and all costs incurred by the scheduling and/or rescheduling of the testing firm's activities by the Contractor and the subsequent delay and/or cancellation of said activities due to the delay and/or cancellation of the scheduled construction by the Contractor.

Item 201 - Clearing and Grubbing

A Lump Sum quantity is included in the bid proposal for Item 201 Clearing and Grubbing. Any necessary clearing and grubbing within the limits of construction, except such objects as are to remain or are to be removed in accordance with other sections of these specifications shall be the responsibility of the Contractor. The Contractor shall keep clearing to a minimum removing only what is necessary to complete construction. It is anticipated that the Contractor will need to perform some tree trimming around the bridge for the crane work. Payment for the work listed above shall be included in the Lump Sum bid price for Item 201 Clearing and Grubbing.

Item 202 - Removals

This work shall consist of the removal, wholly or in part, and satisfactory disposal of all buildings, fences, guardrails, structures, old pavements, abandoned pipe lines, storage tanks, septic tanks, privy vaults, and any other obstructions which are not designated or permitted to remain, except for the obstructions to be removed and disposed of under other items in the contract. It shall also include the salvaging of designated materials and backfilling the resulting trenches, holes, and pits.

Item 202 - Portions of Structure Removed, As Per Plan

The Contractor shall be responsible for all the equipment, materials, and labor necessary in the removal of the bridge rail, concrete box beams, and portions of the reinforced concrete abutments as detailed in the plans. The Contractor shall take into consideration the deterioration and condition of the existing concrete box beams when planning means and methods of removing asphalt wearing surface. The bridge is currently posted for reduced weights based on number of axels per vehicle. The Contractor shall perform the work carefully during the removal to protect portions of the bridge that are to be salvaged and incorporated into the proposed structure. The Contractor shall replace or repair all items that are damaged by the removal operations at no cost to Warren County. Payment for the work listed above shall be included in the Lump Sum bid price for Item 202 Portions of Structure Removed, As Per Plan.

Existing Bridge Plans

The Warren County Engineer can provide the existing bridge plans to the Contractor at their request.

Item 304 - Aggregate Base (Granular Backfill)

Where areas beyond the bridge are in need of roadway fill due to excavation for substructure, Item 304 Aggregate Base shall be used as directed by the Engineer. Item 304 Aggregate Base shall be placed and compacted in the excavated areas in compliance with section 304.05 of the ODOT Construction and Material Specifications. Payment for this work shall be included in the bid price per CY for Item 304 Aggregate Base (Granular Backfill).

Item 407 - Tack Coat

Item 407 Tack Coat shall be applied at a rate of 0.10 gallon per square yard as directed by the Engineer. The application of the tack coat shall be applied to the entire width of the roadway immediately prior to the paving operation. Tack Coat shall be placed prior to the surface course of asphalt. Payment for the work listed above shall be included in the bid price per Gallon for Item 407 Tack Coat.

Asphalt Concrete

All material furnished and work performed shall conform to the 2023 Ohio Department of Transportation Construction and Material Specifications (ODOT CMS) for Item 301 Asphalt Concrete Base and Item 441 Asphalt Concrete Surface Course.

The Contractor shall supply the County Engineer with a weigh ticket for each load of material placed. Periodic asphalt samples will be obtained for test purposes and an independent testing laboratory will perform tests.

No material shall be placed upon collected water. Asphalt surfaces shall be clear of dirt and debris prior to the placing of each subsequent lift. The Contractor shall adhere to the judgment of the Warren County Engineer's designated representatives.

The Contractor's attention is directed to Section 401.14 of the ODOT Specifications and he is hereby instructed that requirements for preparation of asphalt pavement to be resurfaced will be adhered to, and cost of any and all cleaning is to be included in the unit price bid for Item 301 and Item 441.

Butt Joints - A butt joint shall be constructed by grinding/planing existing pavement at each start/stop location. All grinding/ planing shall be in accordance with Item 254 Pavement Planing. The butt joints shall be constructed by grinding/planing the existing pavement for a length of 6 feet, varying in depth from 2" to 0". The newly formed joint shall be properly installed so as to provide a smooth transition and shall also be properly sealed. The cost of constructing each butt joint by pavement planing/grinding shall be included and paid for in Item 441 Asphalt Concrete Surface Course.

<u>Item 503 – Unclassified Excavation</u>

The Contractor shall be responsible for all the labor and equipment necessary in excavating the roadway material behind the existing concrete abutments for removal of portions of the existing bridge and for construction of the new bridge structure. Payment for the work listed above shall be included in the Lump Sum bid price for Item 503 Unclassified Excavation.

Item 511 - Class QC 1 Concrete, Abutment

The Contractor shall be responsible for all the labor and material necessary in constructing the abutments as detailed in the plans. Concrete shall meet all requirements of Item 511 Concrete for Structures. Concrete shall be Class "QC 1" (28 day compressive strength = 4,000 psi). The Contractor shall follow section 499.03 for concrete slump. Payment for the work listed above shall be included in the bid price per CY for Item 511 Class QC 1 Concrete, Abutment.

Item 511 - Class QC 2 Concrete, Superstructure

The Contractor shall be responsible for all the labor and material necessary in constructing the concrete superstructure as detailed in the plans. Concrete shall meet all requirements of Item 511 Concrete for Structures. Concrete shall be Class "QC 2" (28 day compressive strength = 4,500 psi). A corrosion inhibitor admixture per ODOT Specification 515.15 shall be added to the concrete mix at the dosage recommended by the manufacturer. Contractor shall follow section 499.03 for concrete slump, section 511.14 for time duration of removing false work and opening to traffic, and section 511.17 for sawing grooves into the concrete deck. Payment for the work listed above including the expanded polystyrene filler shall be included in the bid price per CY for Item 511 Class QC 2 Concrete, Superstructure.

Item 512 - Sealing of Concrete Surfaces (Epoxy Urethane)

The Contractor shall seal portions of the concrete box beams and concrete bridge deck as detailed in the plans as well as all exposed portions of the concrete abutments with an epoxy urethane sealant after the concrete has cured. The sealing of concrete surfaces shall be in accordance with section 512.03. The Contractor shall take precautions to keep spillage and overspray from entering the stream. The color of the sealant shall be FED# 36492 (gray) or approved equal. Payment for the work listed above shall be included in the bid price per SY for Item 512 Sealing of Concrete Surfaces (Epoxy Urethane).

Item 512 - Treating of Concrete Bridge Deck with SRS

The Contractor shall treat the portion of the concrete bridge deck as detailed in the plans with a soluble reactive silicate sealer after the concrete has cured. The sealing of concrete surfaces shall be in accordance with section 512.05. The Contractor shall take precautions to keep spillage and overspray from entering the stream. The Contractor shall flush the concrete bridge deck with water after the application has had time to dry (see manufacture's recommendation) prior to opening to traffic. Payment for the work listed above shall be included in the price bid per SY for Item 512 Treating of Concrete Bridge Deck with SRS.

Item 515 - Prestressed Concrete Composite Box Beam Bridge Members, Level 1, CB33-48

The Contractor shall be responsible for all the equipment, materials, and labor necessary in setting the six (6) – CB 33" x 48", Prestressed Concrete Box Beam Members. The beams shall conform to the details in the plan set as well as meet the current specifications set forth in the "State of Ohio Department of Transportation Construction and Material Specifications" for Item 515 and Standard Drawings PSBD-2-07 (sheets 1-4) dated 7-20-18. Shop drawings shall be submitted to Roy Henson, Warren County Engineer's Office, 210 W. Main Street, Lebanon, Ohio 45036 (Roy.Henson@co.warren.oh.us) for review and approval. Payment for the work listed above shall be included in the bid price per Each for Item 515 Prestressed Concrete Composite Box Beam Bridge Members, Level 1, CB33-48.

Item Special - Steel Drip Strip

The Contractor shall install steel drip strips on both sides of the bridge for the entire length per ODOT Standard Drawing DS-1-92. This work shall include the separate guardrail pieces. Payment for the work listed above shall be included in the bid price per FT for Item Special Steel Drip Strip.

Item 614 - Maintaining Traffic

Traffic control shall be the sole responsibility of the Contractor. The County of Warren shall be held harmless from liabilities caused by improper traffic control by the Contractor. The contractor shall indemnify Warren County from any and all liabilities due to improper maintenance of traffic. All road construction signs shall also be the responsibility of the

Contractor. All traffic control shall conform to the Ohio Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (OMUTCD) as well as the Ohio Department of Transportation Standards at all times.

Any devices that are determined by the Engineer to be substandard shall be repaired to the satisfaction of the Engineer or shall be immediately removed from the site and replaced with acceptable devices. Any temporary traffic control devices that are determined by the Engineer to become substandard during the course of the project shall be removed from the jobsite and immediately replaced by devices meeting the approval of the Engineer.

The Contractor shall provide and maintain all signs, barricades, labor, flagmen, steel plates, etc. for all work on this project. The Contractor shall notify the Warren County Engineer two (2) weeks prior to any road closure. The Contractor shall provide a minimum of two (2) Type III Barricades on each end of the closed section of McClure Road. The barricades shall be chain linked together and fixed to the ground or some other object overnight. The Contractor shall maintain access to all driveways in the work area for the duration of the project. The Contractor shall provide alternatives to garbage collection services and emergency rescue services for all residents within the closed portions of roadway during the road closures. Any conflicting markings shall be removed or covered in accordance with Item 614.

Two notice of road closure signs shall be erected by the Contractor two weeks in advance of the road closure. The signs shall be erected on the right hand side of the road facing traffic and shall be located in the field so as not to interfere with any permanent signs. The notice of closure signs shall be W20-H13-60 signs and shall state the following......MCCLURE ROAD WILL BE CLOSED FOR 12 WEEKS STARTING (EXACT CLOSURE DATE).

Methods of maintaining traffic shall conform to the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices and Item 614 of the ODOT Specifications. Payment for the work listed above shall be included in the Lump Sum price bid for Item 614 Maintaining Traffic.

Item 623 - Construction Layout Stakes and Surveying

All centerline of survey and property corner monumentation that is disturbed during construction shall be reset by a Professional Surveyor. Payment for the construction layout and work listed above shall be included in the Lump Sum bid price for Item 623 Construction Layout Stakes.

<u>Item 832 – Erosion Control</u>

The Contractor shall furnish and install temporary sediment and erosion control best management practices required prior to any earth disturbing activity in accordance with Supplemental Specification 832. All pollution prevention measures must be maintained for the duration of construction. The Contractor shall remove all best management practices before the project is accepted. Payment for this work shall be included in the bid price per Each for Item 832 Erosion Control. This price is standard for all bidders, set at \$1.00 Each for a total of \$2,500.00.

ODOT's LPA Template (ODOT Spec Book and LPA Spec Book) Required Contract Provisions for STATE-Only Funded Projects

1. ODOT'S 2019 CONSTRUCTION AND MATERIAL SPECIFICATIONS (C&MS) AND ITS SUPPLEMENTS

ODOT's Construction and Material Specifications (C&MS) and its supplements are hereby incorporated by reference, in their entirety, as if rewritten herein. The incorporation of this document by reference does not interfere with the order of precedence set forth in Section 105.04 of the C&MS Manual.

In accordance with the Locally Administrated Transportation Projects Manual of Procedures (LATPM), when bidding this project, the contractor should replace the terms "the department", "the engineer" and "the DCA" with the term "the Local Public Agency (LPA)." Furthermore, nothing in this document is intended to alter the LPA's adherence to Ohio Revised Code, local ordinance or other applicable requirements which are properly established.

2. PREQUALIFICATION

Only prequalified contractors are eligible to submit bids for this PROJECT. Prequalification status must be in force at the time of bid, at the time of award, and through the life of the construction contract. For work types that ODOT does not prequalify, the LPA must still select a qualified contractor. Subcontractors are not subject to the prequalification requirement. The "prime" contractor must perform no less than 30 percent of the total original contract price.

3. STEEL PRODUCTS MADE IN THE UNITED STATES

Domestic steel use requirements as specified in section 153.011 of the Ohio Revised Code apply to this project. Copies of section 153.011 of the Ohio Revised Code can be obtained from any of the offices of the Department of Administrative Services.

4. AS PER PLAN DESIGNATION

The "As Per Plan" designation is sometimes added to item descriptions in the proposal to assist contractors with easily identifying standard items that have been altered by plan notes.

The "As Per Plan" designation has proven to be a very useful tool for contractors. However, its use was never intended to relieve contractors of their responsibility to read, bid, and construct all items in accordance with all governing plan notes. Therefore, the absence of an "As Per Plan" designation on some item descriptions in the proposal for which there are clear and controlling plan notes does not relieve contractors of the responsibility to read, bid, and construct those particular items in accordance with the governing plan notes.

Be advised that the item descriptions in the bidding proposal must be read or interpreted with the governing plan notes and the Construction and Material Specification Manual. A claim based upon an "order of precedence" basis will be denied. In the event that a conflict, either real or perceived, exists between the item description and the governing plan note, contractors are to request clarification through the pre-bid process.

5. PREVAILING WAGES ON STATE PROJECTS WITH NO FEDERAL-AID FUNDING

The following is in addition to C&MS Section 108.10.

This contract is subject to Ohio Prevailing Wage Laws, Chapter 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code. The contractor and all subcontractors shall comply with the provisions contained therein or as otherwise provided by this note. The contractor guarantees the prevailing wage scale to be paid to all laborers and mechanics employed on this contract is in accordance with the schedule of the prevailing hourly wage and fringe benefits as determined by the Ohio Department of Commerce for the county in which the work is being performed. Failure to pay prevailing wages to all laborers and mechanics employed on this project shall be considered a breach of contract. Such a failure may result in the revocation of the contractor's and/or subcontractor's certificate of qualification and debarment. A schedule of the most current prevailing wage rates may be accessed by registering with the Ohio Department of Commerce, Industrial Compliance Division, Bureau of Wage & Hour Administration at the following web address:

The contractor and all subcontractors shall compensate the employees on this contract at a pay rate not less than the hourly wage and fringe rate listed on the website noted above, for the applicable job classification or as may be modified by the Ohio Department of Commerce, Industrial Compliance Division, Bureau of Wage and Hour Administration, when new prevailing rates are established.

Overtime shall be paid at one and one-half times the base hourly rate for any hours worked beyond forty hours during a pay week. The contractor and all subcontractors shall pay all compensation by company funds transfer or legal tender to the worker and fringe benefit program.

The wage and fringe rates determined for this project, or as may be modified later, shall be posted by the contractor in a prominent and accessible place on the project, field office, or equipment yard where they can be easily read by the workers or be otherwise made available to the workers. On the first pay date of the contract work, the contractor and all subcontractors shall furnish each employee covered by prevailing wage a completed form whpw1512 in accordance with section 4115.05 of the Ohio Revised Code showing the classification, hourly pay rate, fringes, and identifying the LPA Prevailing Wage Coordinator (PWC), if such employees are not covered by a collective bargaining agreement or understanding between employers and bona fide organizations of labor. These forms shall be signed by the contractor or subcontractor and the employee and kept in the contractor's or subcontractor's payroll files.

The contractor and all subcontractors shall submit to the PWC or other designated LPA representative certified payrolls on form whpw1509 or equivalent, in accordance with sections 4115.07 and 4115.071 (C) of the Ohio Revised Code, three weeks after the start of work and every subsequent week until the completion of the contract. Additionally, a copy of the "Apprentice Certification" obtained from the Ohio State Apprenticeship Council, must accompany all certified payrolls submitted for all apprentices working on this project. Upon completion of the contract and before the final payment, the contractor shall submit to the PWC a final wage affidavit in accordance with section 4115.07 of the Ohio Revised Code stating wages have been paid in conformance with the minimum rates set forth in the contract. Please be aware that it is ultimately the responsibility of the contractor to ensure all laws relating to prevailing wages in Chapter 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code are strictly adhered to by all subcontractors.

The contractor and all subcontractors shall make all payroll records available for inspection, copying, or transcription by any authorized representative of the contracting agency. Additionally, the contractor and all subcontractors shall permit such representatives to interview any employees during working hours while the employees are on the job.

If the contractor or any subcontractor fails to comply with any of the provisions contained in this proposal note, the LPA may terminate the contract and/or withhold or suspend pay estimates after written notice and a reasonable opportunity to comply has been provided.

6. STATE EEO CERTIFICATION CLAUSE

The hiring of employees for the performance of work under this contract shall be done in accordance with Ohio Revised Code sections 153.59 and 153.591, the Governor's Executive Order of January 27, 1972, including Appendices "A" and "B", and the Governor's amended Executive Order 84-9 of November 30, 1984. The successful contractor shall not discriminate against or intimidate any person hired for the performance of the work by reason of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, sex, or handicap. For any violation, the contractor shall suffer such penalties as provided for in Ohio Revised Code section 153.60 and the Governor Executive Order of January 27, 1972. The bidder also agrees that upon award of this contract they shall incorporate this certification in all subcontracts on this project regardless of tier.

7. UNRESOLVED FINDING FOR RECOVERY

The contractor affirmatively represents to the LPA that it is not subject to a finding for recovery under Ohio Revised Code section 9.24 or that it has taken the appropriate remedial steps required under section 9.24 or otherwise qualifies under that section. The contractor agrees that if this representation is deemed to be false, the contract shall be void ab initio as between the parties to this contract, and any funds paid by the state hereunder shall be immediately repaid to the LPA or an action for recovery may be immediately commenced by the LPA and/or for recovery of said funds.

8. ASSIGNMENT OF ANTITRUST CLAIMS IN STATE CONTRACT LANGUAGE

The contractor should recognize that in actual economic practice, overcharges resulting from antitrust violations are usually borne by ODOT and/or the LPA. As consideration for the Award of the Contract and intent to be legally bound, the contractor acting herein by and through the person signing this contract on behalf of the contractor as a duly authorized agent, hereby assigns, sells, conveys, and transfers to ODOT and/or the LPA any and all right, title and interest to any and all claims and causes of action the contractor now has or hereafter requires under state or federal antitrust laws provided that the claims or causes of action related to the goods or services that are the subject to the contract. In addition, the contractor warrants and represents that it will require all of its subcontractors and first tier suppliers to assign all federal and state antitrust claims and causes of action to ODOT and/or the LPA. The provisions of this article shall become effective at the time the LPA executes this contract without further acknowledgment by any of the parties.

All contracting entities shall assign their rights and responsibilities to ODOT and/or the LPA for all antitrust claims and causes of action regarding subcontractors.

9. US ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS AND OHIO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY PERMITS

The above referenced permits are incorporated and made part of this contract as special provisions incorporated herein. Therefore, in the event the contractor or its agents refuse or fail to adhere to the requirements of the 404 Permit and/or the NPDES Stormwater Permit resulting in an assessment or fine made or levied against ODOT and/or the LPA, the contractor shall reimburse ODOT and/or the LPA within thirty (30) calendar days of the notice of assessment or fine, or the LPA and/or ODOT may withhold the amount of the fine from the contractor's next pay estimate. All money collected or withheld from the contractor shall be delivered to the permitting agencies issuing the assessment or fine.

These fines are not to be construed as a penalty but are liquidated damages to recover costs assessed against the LPA and/or ODOT due to the contractor's refusal or failure to comply with the permits.

10. OHIO WORKERS' COMPENSATION COVERAGE

The contractor must secure and maintain valid Ohio workers' compensation coverage until the project has been finally accepted by ODOT. A certificate of coverage evidencing valid workers' compensation coverage must be submitted to the LPA before the contract will be executed by the LPA.

The contractor must immediately notify the LPA in writing if it or any subcontractor fails or refuses to renew their workers' compensation coverage. Furthermore, the contractor must notify the LPA in writing if its or any of its subcontractor's workers' compensation policies are canceled, terminated, or lapse.

The failure to maintain valid workers' compensation coverage shall be considered a breach of contract, which may result in the contractor or subcontractor being removed from the project, withholding of pay estimates, and/or termination of the contract.

11. PN 034 - 05/25/2011 - DRUG FREE SAFETY PROGRAM

During the life of this project, the contractor and all its subcontractors who provide labor on the project site must be enrolled in and remain in good standing in the Ohio Bureau of Worker's Compensation (OBWC) Drug-Free Safety Program (DFSP) or a comparable program approved by the OBWC.

In addition to being enrolled in and in good standing in an OBWC-approved DFSP or a comparable Drug Free Workplace Program (DFWP) approved by the OBWC, the department requires each contractor and subcontractor that provides labor to subject its employees who perform labor on the project site to random drug testing of five (5) percent of its employees. The random drug testing percentage must also include the on-site supervisors of the contractors and subcontractors. Upon request, the contractor and subcontractor shall provide evidence of required testing to the department.

Each subcontractor shall require all lower-tier subcontractors who provide labor on the project site with whom the subcontractor is in contract for the work to be enrolled in and be in good standing in the OBWC DFSP or an OBWC-approved DFWP prior to a lower-tier subcontractor providing labor at the site.

The department will declare a bid non-responsive and ineligible for award if the contractor is not enrolled in and in good standing in the OBWC's DFSP Discount Program or a similar program approved by the OBWC within eight (8) days of the bid opening. Furthermore, the department will deny all requests to sublet when the subcontractor does not comply with the provisions of this proposal note.

Failure of the contractor to require a subcontractor to be enrolled in and be in good standing in the OBWC DFSP or an OBWC-approved DFWP prior to the time the subcontractor provides labor at the site shall result in the contractor being found in breach of the contract and that breach shall be used in the responsibility analysis of that contractor or the subcontractor who was not enrolled in a program for future contracts with the State for five (5) years after the date of the breach.

12. WAIVER OF C&MS 614.03

ODOT's 2019 Construction and Material Specifications section 614.03, third paragraph, does not apply to any project which is not physically located on the National Highway System (NHS) and/or does not impact NHS traffic in any way.

13. ODOT AS OBLIGEE ON BOND

The contractor shall furnish a performance and payment bond in an amount at least equal to 100 percent of the estimate as security for the faithful performance of its contract. In addition to the project owner, ODOT shall be named as an obligee.

14. PN 032 - 01/31/2021 - C92s REQUIRED ON LOCAL-LET CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

State and federal law requires all contractors and subcontractors participating in state or federally funded projects to be evidenced in writing and in conformity with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations.

Effective immediately, all projects advertising after 2/1/2021 will require a Request to Sublet (C92) form be completed for each subcontractor working on the project prior to the start of work. This will include all EDGE and non-EDGE material suppliers utilized on the project.

A template for this form may be found and submitted via the GoFormz website located at https://www.goformz.com/.

15. PN 031 - 4/6/2023 - LOCAL-LET CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

ODOT, along with the LPA, shall monitor payments made by the prime contractor and subcontractors for compliance with this Proposal Note and C&MS 107.21. To facilitate this monitoring, the Department requires both prime and subcontractors to report their payments to all subcontractors/second-tier subcontractors with the submission of each invoice. The payment data reported must include any retainage withheld (when allowable under the department's <u>Retainage Policy dated 4/14/21</u>) and any previously withheld retainage released. All such reporting must take place through a web-based submission on GoFormz. Please note: submission through GoFormz is required for <u>all Local-let projects</u>. Invoices will not be approved and processed for payment unless this reporting form has been submitted and received by the department.

The prime/subcontractor must report the following information:

- The name of the payee;
- The dollar amount of the payment to the payee;
- The date the payee was paid;
- The amount of retainage withheld (if any).

The prime/subcontractor(s) must sign each reported payment and submit to ODOT via the GoFormz website.

The second-tier subcontractor is responsible for completing the affirmation of payment form in GoFormz.

The prime contractor is responsible for ensuring that all subcontractors and second-tier subcontractors are correctly completing all prompt payment forms via the GoFormz website.

If the prime or subcontractor(s) fail to submit the aforementioned documentation with each invoice, they will be determined to be non-compliant and invoices will not be processed for payment.

Payee must verify each payment reported by the payer within thirty (30) days of the payment being signed by the payer. This verification must include:

- · Whether the payment was received, and if so, whether it was or was not as expected
- The dollar amount of the payment received
- The date the payment was received

The prime contractor shall fully complete the last prompt payment form upon receipt of final payment.

SANCTIONS AND ADMINISTRATIVE REMEDIES

Failure by the prime contractor and/or subcontractor(s) to follow Prompt Payment requirements may result in the issuance of sanctions as follows:

1st Tier: Notice of Violation followed by a Letter of Reprimand

2nd Tier: If corrective actions are not taken within the specified three (3) business days, a pay estimate in the amount due to the subcontractor(s) that was not reported or paid may be withheld.

3rd Tier: If a pattern of paying damages persists or the contractor has falsified, misrepresented, or withheld information, ODOT will pursue other remedies available by law including suspension, revocation, and/or debarment.

Factors to be considered in issuing sanctions may include, but are not limited to the following:

- · the magnitude and type of offense
- · the degree of the contractor's culpability
- · any steps taken to rectify
- the contractor's record of performance on other projects
- the number of times the contractor has been previously sanctioned by ODOT

16. PN 022 - 04/15/2013 - ENCOURAGING DIVERSITY, GROWTH, AND EQUITY (EDGE) REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 122.922, amended 9/30/2021, guiding EDGE program requirements, the percentage indicated on the front cover of this bid is the percent of the awarded contractor's bid. The percentage goal may be met if the contractor is EDGE certified or by subcontracting to certified EDGE firms. EDGE certified firms are those who have been certified by the Ohio Department of Development. If not EDGE certified, the contractor must use its best effort to solicit quotes from and to utilize EDGE subcontractors/suppliers on this project.

WAIVER PROCESS FOR EDGE GOAL

If not EDGE certified, the contractor must document the progress and efforts made to secure the services of EDGE certified subcontractors/suppliers. There will be no extension of time for the project granted if the contractor wishes to avail itself of this process. If an item of work subcontracted to an EDGE firm is non-performed by the department or is the subject of an approved VECP, the contractor may request a waiver for the portion of work excluded.

The department shall consider the following information and documentation when a request for an EDGE goal waiver is received:

- Dollar value and % of EDGE goal. Dollar value and % of waiver request.
- Signed copy of each subcontract or purchase order agreement between the contractor and EDGE subcontractor/supplier utilized in meeting the contract goal.
- Copy of dated written communication, fax confirmation, personal contact, follow-up and negotiation with the BDGE subcontractor/supplier.
- Copy of dated written communication and/or fax confirmation that bidder solicited and provided EDGE subcontractor/supplier with adequate information about the plans, specifications, and requirements of the contract in a timely manner to assist them in responding to a solicitation.

- Copy of dated written communication and/or fax confirmation of each noncompetitive EDGE quote that includes the dollar value of each reference item and work type.
- Copy of dated written communication and/or dated fax confirmation of EDGE subcontractor/supplier that were not interested in providing a quote for the project.
- All solicitations made by the contractor for subcontracting opportunities and EDGE quotes through SBN.
- Documentation of all negotiating efforts and reason for rejecting quotes from EDGE subcontractor/supplier.
- Documentation of good faith efforts (GFE) to meet the EDGE subcontract goal by looking beyond the items typically subcontracted or consideration of subcontracting items normally performed by the prime contractor as a way to meet the EDGE goal.

The Administrator will review the submitted documentation and issue a written decision within ten (10) business days. The contractor may request administrative reconsideration within fourteen (14) days of being informed that it did not perform a GFE. The contractor must make this request in writing to the following official:

The reconsideration official will not have played any role in the original determination that the contractor did not document sufficient good faith efforts.

As part of this reconsideration, the contractor will have the opportunity to provide written documentation or an argument concerning the issue of whether it met the goal or made adequate good faith efforts to do so. ODOT will send the contractor a written decision on reconsideration explaining the basis for finding that the contractor did or did not meet the goal or make adequate good faith efforts. The result of the reconsideration process may be appealed to the Court of Claims.

AFFIDAVIT OF SUBCONTRACTOR PAYMENTS MADE TO EDGE SUBCONTRACTORS/SUPPLIERS

The Ohio Revised Code 122.922 requires ODOT to monitor and verify the work subcontracted to EDGE subcontractors/suppliers is actually performed by the EDGE subcontractor/supplier. The affidavit seeks to verify payments made to EDGE subcontractors/suppliers on the project. Each EDGE subcontractor/supplier must verify the actual payment amount.

The blank spaces in the affidavit must be filled in correctly where indicated. The affidavit must be signed by the contractor and subcontractor or by the subcontractor and EDGE subcontractor/supplier, if applicable. By signing the affidavit, the noted subcontractors/suppliers agree the payment amount recorded is true and accurate as of the payment time period.

SANCTIONS FOR FAILURE TO MEET EDGE GOAL AND DEMONSTRATE GOOD FAITH EFFORT

ODOT will issue sanctions if the contractor chooses not to request a waiver, fails to comply with the contract requirements, and/or fails to demonstrate the necessary good faith effort.

ODOT may impose any of the following sanctions:

- Letter of Reprimand
- liquidated damages computed up to the amount of goal dollars not met
- cross-withhold from future projects
- contract termination
- other remedies available by law including suspension, revocation, and/or debarment

Factors to be considered in issuing sanctions include, but are not limited to:

- the magnitude and the type of offense
- the degree of the contractor's culpability
- any steps taken to rectify the situation
- the contractor's record of performance on other projects including, but not limited to:
 - o annual EDGE participation over EDGE goals;
 - o annual EDGE participation on projects without goals;
 - o number of complaints ODOT has received from EDGE subcontractors/suppliers regarding the contractor; and
 - o number of times the contractor has been previously sanctioned by ODOT
- whether the contractor falsified, misrepresented, or withheld information

Upon entering into a contract with the Owner, the contractor must file a performance bond for the amount of the contract, and the bid guaranty will then be returned to the successful and unsuccessful bidders upon contract execution.
