Tom Grossman The 101st Commissioner of Warren County



Our new Warren County Commissioner, Tom Grossmann, officially took office Monday, January 5, 2015. We welcome Commissioner Grossmann to the Warren County government. Tom grew up on a horse farm in Springfield Township, Ohio with his father and mother, Judge David and Peggy Grossmann, and his brother John. He worked on the farm and took care of it for almost 30 years. Tom and his brother John still run the farm. After Tom graduated from Greenhills High School, he went to Miami University and then to the College of Law at the University of Cincinnati.

Upon his graduation from law school, Tom worked as a clerk for Judge William O. Bertelsmann of the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky. After that he joined Taft, Stettinius and Hollister where he worked for over 26 years, first as an associate and then as a partner.

Tom and his family moved to Milan, Italy for four years from 1994 to 1998 while he worked as Assistant General Counsel for Italy's largest international company, Montedison.

Upon returning from Italy, Tom rejoined Taft Stettinius and Hollister and moved to Mason, Ohio. Tom was elected to Mason City Council in 2001 where he served until his second term ended at the end of November 2009. Tom now works as an Assistant Prosecutor under Hamilton County Prosecutor Joseph T. Deters. Tom was elected to Mason City Council again in November 2011 and served on council and on its Economic Development and Finance Committees until taking office with the Board of County Commissioners.

Reminder: Business and Residential Alarms

When taking calls for business and residential alarms you need to obtain the following information:

- Address of the alarm
- Resident's last name or name of business
- Premise phone number
- Alarm company name and operator's name or number
- Location of alarm
- If they are attempting a key holder and any other pertinent information.

Also when an alarm company calls back with additional information, make sure you get the operator name or number so that we know who you talked to.

Did You Know?

Mutual Aid TAC Channels (MATAC##)

Mutual Aid TACs allow for regional communications without having to program every neighboring county's radio system into your county subscriber's radios. There are 2 zones of MATACs. The first zone is MATACS 1-14. The second zone is MATACS 15-28.

MATACs are ONLY for county-to-county mutual aid, NOT for single-county incidents. When communication between 2 different county agencies is needed and they do not have the other counties fire ground you can patch a Warren County TAC channel with a MATAC channel as long as the MATAC isn't already patched. All radios will eventually have (SW) added to the beginning of their MATAC channels. Dispatch will make every effort to announce the MATAC with and without (SW) until every radio is updated.

Call of the Month

On Monday, December 22nd at 20:13 Dispatcher Rob Plummer took a call from a man and his son who had become disoriented and lost in the woods while tracking a deer near Caesar's Creek Camp Ground. As darkness fell, they were unable to find their way out of the woods and back to their car. Using Phase II on our 911 system, Rob was able to determine that the pair was only a few hundred yards off the road near the intersection of Center Road and White Oak. He attempted to walk the caller through the use of a compass as well as the navigation on his phone without success. With only 9% battery life remaining on his cell phone, Rob made the decision to disconnect with the caller.

Once Deputy Turner arrived in the area, Rob re-contacted the caller and had him dial 911 again. While Turner sounded his sirens and activated his lights, Rob continued to rebid the call to ensure that the pair was moving towards Turner at the roadway. Finally, at 20:49, the caller reported that he could see the lights on the cruiser. Rob Plummer's quick actions and line of questioning assisted the caller to safety and kept the incident from becoming tragic. Great Job Rob and Deputy Turner!
