Warren County Sheriff's Deputy Henry "Hank" Arnett

It is with deep sorrow that we announce the loss of retired Deputy Henry "Hank" Arnett. Hank passed away on September 23rd at UC Medical Center and was laid to rest on September 28th.

Hank retired from the US Marine Corp in 1995 and began his career with Warren County in July 1998 as a Corrections Officer. Hank was hired as a Deputy Sheriff in October 2002. He worked the County Road Patrol until 2005 when he moved to Court Services. Hank resigned on March 31, 2014.

Tony Abston's career as a firefighter spanned 20 years. He retired 2 years ago due to health issues. In addition to working for Franklin, he worked at Carlisle Fire Department and also at Joint Emergency Medical Service (JEMS).

The Warren County Communications Center had seven new ECOs starting their training on October 2nd. They will spend their first week in a classroom orientation where, in addition to filling out paperwork, they will begin going over policies and learning call types, police and fire agency IDs, and being introduced to the various other agencies with which we work.

Next week they will begin to learn basic CAD functions and will be drilled with various scenarios, handling incidents that they will soon be



dealing with themselves! They are also scheduled for a radio class with Gary Hardwick from Telecommunications and a tour of the jail and JDC.

Call of the Month

On September 15th, just before midnight ECC Andy Jackson took a call from a nine-year-old boy who said that his uncle had a bad cut on his head but would not tell him what had happened. Andy went through the protocol with the child, stopping to help him understand his questions and instructions.

Andy displayed a great deal of compassion with the boy, patiently explaining what he needed to do. When the paramedics arrived, he even asked to speak with the young boy again just to assure him and let him know what a good job he had done in reporting the emergency by answering all of the questions and remaining calm.

Medics from ST46 were dispatched to an unconscious subject with a head injury. The call turned out to be somewhat more than just a squad run however—as it turned out there were two victims of an assault with one deceased. The Warren County Sheriff's Department is handling that investigation. Great job, Andy!
