

H.B. COMMUNICATION 115 DISABILITY REGISTRY

EFFECTIVE: AUGUST 1, 2018

Effective August 1, 2018, House Bill 115 allows an individual to voluntarily submit a verification form, signed by their physician, to the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles to be designated as an individual with a communication disability.

The legislation aims to be a positive, beneficial resource for the law enforcement community and people who suffer from communication disabilities such as autism, a hearing impairment or PTSD.

By notifying officers that the driver may have difficulty speaking before they approach the vehicle, the officer can put into action their training for how to best serve disabled individuals.


The bill allows Ohioans (adults and minors enrolled by parents/guardians) to voluntarily enroll in a protected LEADS database available only to criminal justice agencies.



1872 School House

This replicated one room school house is located at YMCA Camp Kern.

In 2012, Lebanon resident Tom Mullet, 92 years of age wanted to preserve the original school house in honor of his late wife, Ellen Miller Mullett, who attended school there as a child.

Originally on Hart Road in the city of Lebanon; bricks, lime foundation, fixtures and stone steps from the Hart School were all preserved and moved in 2012.
